mouth-watering Pleasing to the sense of taste.

piquant Pleasantly stimulating or exciting to the mind.
*A **piquant** tartare sauce.*

savoury Having an appetizing taste or smell.
*Everyone knew it was a front for less **savoury** operations.*

zesty Having an agreeably pungent taste.

acidic	(of a colour) strikingly intense or bright. <i>The occasional acidic comment.</i>
acidulous	Sharp-tasting; sour.
ambrosial	Extremely pleasing to the taste; sweet and fragrant. <i>Ambrosial food.</i>
appetizing	Appealing to or stimulating the appetite especially in appearance or aroma. <i>The appetizing aroma of sizzling bacon.</i>
comestible	An item of food. <i>Sugar coffee and sundry other comestible requisites.</i>
<u>delectable</u>	Capable of arousing sexual desire. <i>The delectable Ms Davis.</i>
delicious	Highly pleasant to the taste. <i>Delicious home baked brown bread.</i>

eatable	Any substance that can be used as food. <i>Eatable fruits.</i>
<u>edible</u>	Items of food. <i>The dinner was barely edible.</i>
<u>flavor</u>	Lend flavor to.
<u>flavorful</u>	Full of flavor.
flavour	A substance used to alter or enhance the taste of food or drink a flavouring. <i>Adding sun dried tomatoes gives the sauce extra flavour.</i>
<u>luscious</u>	Very sexually attractive. <i>He ll fall for a luscious Spanish girl who can match him in passion.</i>
<u>meal</u>	The food eaten during a meal. <i>A bar serving light meals.</i>
nip	Sever or remove by pinching or snipping. <i>He nipped off a length of wire with the cutters.</i>
<u>palatable</u>	(of food or drink) pleasant to taste. <i>Palatable food.</i>
piquancy	A tart spicy quality. <i>The tragedy only adds piquancy to the tale.</i>
pungency	A strong odor or taste property. <i>He commented with typical pungency.</i>
repast	A meal. <i>A sumptuous repast.</i>
<u>savor</u>	Derive or receive pleasure from; get enjoyment from; take pleasure in. <i>Savor the soup.</i>
savour	The taste experience when a savoury condiment is taken into the mouth. <i>Their genuflections savoured of superstition and popery.</i>
<u>sour</u>	Go sour or spoil. <i>The meeting ended on a sour note.</i>
<u>spicy</u>	Producing a burning sensation on the taste nerves. <i>I like my chili extra spicy.</i>
<u>sweet</u>	A sweet dish forming a course of a meal a pudding or dessert. <i>A bunch of sweet scented flowers.</i>
tang	Any of various coarse seaweeds. <i>His words came out with a distinct tang of broad Lancashire.</i>
tangy	Having a strong, piquant flavour or smell. <i>A tangy salad.</i>

- taste** Have a distinctive or characteristic taste.
*Take a **taste** you ll like it.*
- tasty** (of food) having a pleasant, distinct flavour.
*A **tasty** young lady.*
- zesty** Marked by spirited enjoyment.
