**piquant** Pleasantly stimulating or exciting to the mind.  
*A **piquant** tartare sauce.*

**savoury** Having an appetizing taste or smell.  
*Everyone knew it was a front for less **savoury** operations.*

**zesty** Having an agreeably pungent taste.

- ambrosial** Extremely pleasing to the taste; sweet and fragrant.

- appetizing** Appealing to or stimulating the appetite especially in appearance or aroma.  
*The **appetizing** aroma of sizzling bacon.*
- comestible** An item of food.  
*Sugar coffee and sundry other **comestible** requisites.*
- delectable** Capable of arousing sexual desire.  
*The **delectable** Ms Davis.*
- delicious** Highly pleasant to the taste.  
***Delicious** home baked brown bread.*

<b>eatable</b>	Any substance that can be used as food. <i>Eatable</i> fruits.
<b>edible</b>	Items of food. <i>The dinner was barely <b>edible</b>.</i>
<b>flavor</b>	Lend flavor to.
<b>flavorful</b>	Full of flavor.
<b>flavour</b>	A substance used to alter or enhance the taste of food or drink a flavouring. <i>Adding sun dried tomatoes gives the sauce extra <b>flavour</b>.</i>
<b>luscious</b>	Very sexually attractive. <i>He ll fall for a <b>luscious</b> Spanish girl who can match him in passion.</i>
<b>meal</b>	The food eaten during a meal. <i>A bar serving light <b>meals</b>.</i>
<b>nip</b>	Sever or remove by pinching or snipping. <i>He <b>nipped</b> off a length of wire with the cutters.</i>
<b>palatable</b>	(of food or drink) pleasant to taste. <i><b>Palatable</b> food.</i>
<b>piquancy</b>	A tart spicy quality. <i>The tragedy only adds <b>piquancy</b> to the tale.</i>
<b>pungency</b>	A strong odor or taste property. <i>He commented with typical <b>pungency</b>.</i>
<b>repast</b>	A meal. <i>A sumptuous <b>repast</b>.</i>
<b>savor</b>	Derive or receive pleasure from; get enjoyment from; take pleasure in. <i><b>Savor</b> the soup.</i>
<b>savour</b>	The taste experience when a savoury condiment is taken into the mouth. <i>Their genuflections <b>savoured</b> of superstition and popery.</i>
<b>sour</b>	Go sour or spoil. <i>The meeting ended on a <b>sour</b> note.</i>
<b>spicy</b>	Producing a burning sensation on the taste nerves. <i>I like my chili extra <b>spicy</b>.</i>
<b>sweet</b>	A sweet dish forming a course of a meal a pudding or dessert. <i>A bunch of <b>sweet</b> scented flowers.</i>
<b>tang</b>	Any of various coarse seaweeds. <i>His words came out with a distinct <b>tang</b> of broad Lancashire.</i>
<b>tangy</b>	Having a strong, piquant flavour or smell. <i>A <b>tangy</b> salad.</i>

**taste** Have a distinctive or characteristic taste.  
*Take a **taste** you ll like it.*

**tasty** (of food) having a pleasant, distinct flavour.  
*A **tasty** young lady.*

**zesty** Marked by spirited enjoyment.
