comestible	An item of food. Sugar coffee and sundry other <b>comestible</b> requisites.
<u>delectable</u>	Capable of arousing sexual desire. <i>The <b>delectable</b> Ms Davis.</i>

flavour	A substance used to alter or enhance the taste of food or drink a flavouring. Adding sun dried tomatoes gives the sauce extra <b>flavour</b> .
<u>luscious</u>	Very sexually attractive. He ll fall for a <b>luscious</b> Spanish girl who can match him in passion.
<u>meal</u>	The food eaten during a meal. A bar serving light <b>meal</b> s.
nip	Sever or remove by pinching or snipping. He <b>nip</b> ped off a length of wire with the cutters.
<u>palatable</u>	(of food or drink) pleasant to taste. <b>Palatable</b> food.
piquancy	A tart spicy quality. The tragedy only adds <b>piquancy</b> to the tale.
pungency	A strong odor or taste property. <i>He commented with typical <b>pungency</b>.</i>
repast	A meal. A sumptuous <b>repast</b> .
<u>savor</u>	Derive or receive pleasure from; get enjoyment from; take pleasure in. <i>Savor</i> the soup.
savour	The taste experience when a savoury condiment is taken into the mouth. Their genuflections <b>savour</b> ed of superstition and popery.
<u>sour</u>	Go sour or spoil. The meeting ended on a <b>sour</b> note.
<u>spicy</u>	Producing a burning sensation on the taste nerves. I like my chili extra <b>spicy</b> .
<u>sweet</u>	A sweet dish forming a course of a meal a pudding or dessert. A bunch of <b>sweet</b> scented flowers.
tang	Any of various coarse seaweeds. His words came out with a distinct <b>tang</b> of broad Lancashire.
tangy	Having a strong, piquant flavour or smell. A <b>tangy</b> salad.



taste	Have a distinctive or characteristic taste. Take a <b>taste</b> you ll like it.
<u>tasty</u>	(of food) having a pleasant, distinct flavour. A <b>tasty</b> young lady.
zestv	Marked by spirited enjoyment.
