## Definitions of "Saw" as a noun

According to the <u>Oxford Dictionary of English</u>, "saw" as a noun can have the following definitions:

- A power tool for cutting wood.
- A serrated organ or part, such as the toothed snout of a sawfish.
- A condensed but memorable saying embodying some important fact of experience that is taken as true by many people.
- Hand tool having a toothed blade for cutting.
- A hand tool for cutting wood or other hard materials, typically with a long, thin serrated blade and operated using a backwards and forwards movement.
- A mechanical power-driven tool for cutting which has a toothed rotating disc or moving band.

<u>adage</u>	A proverb or short statement expressing a general truth. The old <b>adage</b> out of sight out of mind.
byword	A person or thing cited as a notable and outstanding example or embodiment of something. Small is beautiful may be the <b>byword</b> for most couturiers.
power saw	Holding an office means being in power.
proverb	A short, well-known pithy saying, stating a general truth or piece of advice.

**sawing machine** A power tool for cutting wood.





## Associations of "Saw" (30 Words)

**angularity** A shape having one or more sharp angles.

<u>blade</u>	A cutting or thrusting weapon that has a long metal blade and a hilt with a hand guard. The director a young <b>blade</b> in an oversized suit.
<u>chain</u>	Fasten or secure with a chain. As an actuary you will not be <b>chain</b> ed to a desk.
chop	Form or shape by chopping. Hundreds more workers have been given the <b>chop</b> .
clipping	The act of clipping or snipping. I sent him a bundle of <b>clipping</b> s that amply documented my charge.
cutting	The act of cutting something into parts. <i>Cutting</i> winter winds.



<u>dagger</u>	A moth with a dark dagger shaped marking on the forewing. <i>He drew his <b>dagger</b> and stabbed the leader.</i>
<u>hack</u>	Cut with a hacking tool. He <b>hack</b> ed his way through the forest.
javelin	The athletic sport of throwing a javelin. <i>His nearest rival in the <b>javelin</b>.</i>
jig	Equip a factory or workshop with a jig or jigs. We were <b>jig</b> ging about in our seats.
lancet	A lancet arch or window. A <b>lancet</b> clock.
mace	An official who carries a mace of office.
microtome	Scientific instrument that cuts thin slices of something for microscopic examination.
piece	Repair by adding pieces. A chess <b>piece</b> .
razor	Cut with a razor. The tapered cut is <b>razor</b> ed to give movement.
reel	Dance a reel. The two <b>reel</b> ed out of the bar arm in arm.
scabbard	A sheath for a gun or other weapon or tool. A ceremonial sword hung at his side in a gilded <b>scabbard</b> .
scissor	Cut something with scissors. Pages <b>scissor</b> ed out of a magazine.
scissors	Denoting an action in which two things cross each other or open and close like the blades of a pair of scissors. <i>A dummy scissors from David Thomas deceived the opposition.</i>
scraper	A prehistoric flint implement with a sharpened edge used for scraping material such as hide or wood. Residues should be removed with sharp <b>scraper</b> s.
serration	A single notch in a row of notches. The pliers had <b>serration</b> s to improve the grip.
<u>sever</u>	Cut off from a whole. His head was <b>sever</b> ed from his body.
sheathe	Put (a weapon such as a knife or sword) into a sheath. <i>Her legs were <b>sheathe</b>d in black stockings.</i>
slit	Form one s eyes into slits squint. <i>Slit</i> the throat of the victim.



smith	United States blues singer (1894-1937. We do not know whether the metals were mined and smelted by the <b>smith</b> or purchased from miners.
snip	The act of clipping or snipping. The wine is a <b>snip</b> at 3 65.
<u>spear</u>	Pierce with a spear. Smoked salmon wrapped around asparagus <b>spear</b> s.
<u>sword</u>	Military power, violence, or destruction. Not many perished by the <b>sword</b> .
tool	A small stamp or roller used to make a tooled design. The ability to write clearly is a <b>tool</b> of the trade.
trident	A spear with three prongs.
