### Definitions of "Saw" as a noun


According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “saw” as a noun can have the following definitions:

- *A power tool for cutting wood.*
- *A serrated organ or part, such as the toothed snout of a sawfish.*
- *A condensed but memorable saying embodying some important fact of experience that is taken as true by many people.*
- *Hand tool having a toothed blade for cutting.*
- *A hand tool for cutting wood or other hard materials, typically with a long, thin serrated blade and operated using a backwards and forwards movement.*
- *A mechanical power-driven tool for cutting which has a toothed rotating disc or moving band.*



## Synonyms of "Saw" as a noun (5 Words)

<b><u>adage</u></b>	A proverb or short statement expressing a general truth. <i>The old <b>adage</b> out of sight out of mind.</i>
<b>byword</b>	A person or thing cited as a notable and outstanding example or embodiment of something. <i>Small is beautiful may be the <b>byword</b> for most couturiers.</i>
<b>power saw</b>	Holding an office means being in power.
<b>proverb</b>	A short, well-known pithy saying, stating a general truth or piece of advice.
<b>sawing machine</b>	A power tool for cutting wood.



## Associations of "Saw" (30 Words)

**angularity** A shape having one or more sharp angles.

**blade** A cutting or thrusting weapon that has a long metal blade and a hilt with a hand guard.

*The director a young **blade** in an oversized suit.*

**chain** Fasten or secure with a chain.

*As an actuary you will not be **chained** to a desk.*

**chop** Form or shape by chopping.

*Hundreds more workers have been given the **chop**.*

**clipping** The act of clipping or snipping.

*I sent him a bundle of **clippings** that amply documented my charge.*

**cutting** The act of cutting something into parts.

***Cutting** winter winds.*

<b>dagger</b>	A moth with a dark dagger shaped marking on the forewing. <i>He drew his <b>dagger</b> and stabbed the leader.</i>
<b>hack</b>	Cut with a hacking tool. <i>He <b>hacked</b> his way through the forest.</i>
<b>javelin</b>	The athletic sport of throwing a javelin. <i>His nearest rival in the <b>javelin</b>.</i>
<b>jig</b>	Equip a factory or workshop with a jig or jigs. <i>We were <b>jigging</b> about in our seats.</i>
<b>lancet</b>	A lancet arch or window. <i>A <b>lancet</b> clock.</i>
<b>mace</b>	An official who carries a mace of office.
<b>microtome</b>	Scientific instrument that cuts thin slices of something for microscopic examination.
<b>piece</b>	Repair by adding pieces. <i>A chess <b>piece</b>.</i>
<b>razor</b>	Cut with a razor. <i>The tapered cut is <b>razored</b> to give movement.</i>
<b>reel</b>	Dance a reel. <i>The two <b>reeled</b> out of the bar arm in arm.</i>
<b>scabbard</b>	A sheath for a gun or other weapon or tool. <i>A ceremonial sword hung at his side in a gilded <b>scabbard</b>.</i>
<b>scissor</b>	Cut something with scissors. <i>Pages <b>scissored</b> out of a magazine.</i>
<b>scissors</b>	Denoting an action in which two things cross each other or open and close like the blades of a pair of scissors. <i>A dummy <b>scissors</b> from David Thomas deceived the opposition.</i>
<b>scraper</b>	A prehistoric flint implement with a sharpened edge used for scraping material such as hide or wood. <i>Residues should be removed with sharp <b>scrapers</b>.</i>
<b>serration</b>	A single notch in a row of notches. <i>The pliers had <b>serrations</b> to improve the grip.</i>
<b>sever</b>	Cut off from a whole. <i>His head was <b>severed</b> from his body.</i>
<b>sheathe</b>	Put (a weapon such as a knife or sword) into a sheath. <i>Her legs were <b>sheathed</b> in black stockings.</i>
<b>slit</b>	Form one's eyes into slits squint. <i><b>Slit</b> the throat of the victim.</i>

- smith** United States blues singer (1894-1937).  
*We do not know whether the metals were mined and smelted by the **smith** or purchased from miners.*
- snip** The act of clipping or snipping.  
*The wine is a **snip** at 3 65.*
- spear** Pierce with a spear.  
*Smoked salmon wrapped around asparagus **spears**.*
- sword** Military power, violence, or destruction.  
*Not many perished by the **sword**.*
- tool** A small stamp or roller used to make a tooled design.  
*The ability to write clearly is a **tool** of the trade.*
- trident** A spear with three prongs.
