## Associations of "Scaffold" (30 Words)

<b>ascend</b>	(of a voice or sound) rise in pitch. <i>The road <b>ascends</b> to the loch.</i>
<b>ascending</b>	The act of changing location in an upward direction. <i>Incomes ranked in <b>ascending</b> order of size.</i>
<b>ascent</b>	An instance of rising or moving up through the air. <i>The <b>ascent</b> grew steeper.</i>
<b>ax</b>	Chop or split with an ax. <i>The NSF <b>axed</b> the research program and stopped funding it.</i>
<a href="#">axe</a>	Cut or strike with an axe especially violently or destructively. <i>Thirty staff are facing the <b>axe</b> at the Royal Infirmary.</i>
<b>behead</b>	Cut the head of. <i>Mary was <b>beheaded</b> at Fotheringhay.</i>
<b>block</b>	An act of blocking someone or something. <i>They put their paintings on the <b>block</b>.</i>
<b>clamber</b>	Climb or move in an awkward and laborious way, typically using both hands and feet. <i>I <b>clambered</b> out of the trench.</i>
<a href="#">climb</a>	The act of climbing something. <i>The rate of <b>climb</b> can be set by the pilot.</i>
<a href="#">climbing</a>	The sport or activity of climbing mountains or cliffs. <i><b>Climbing</b> equipment.</i>
<b>cubic</b>	A cubic equation or a curve described by one. <i>A <b>cubic</b> room.</i>
<a href="#">floor</a>	Provide a room or area with a floor. <i>A stone <b>floored</b> building.</i>
<b>hang</b>	Be suspended or hanging. <i>He adjusted the <b>hang</b> of his coat.</i>

<b>height</b>	The quality of being tall or high. <i>Her <b>height</b> marked her out from other women.</i>
<b>ladder</b>	With reference to tights or stockings develop or cause to develop a ladder. <i>The first time I put them on one of the stockings <b>laddered</b>.</i>
<b>lade</b>	Fill or place a load on. <i>The surplus products must be <b>laden</b> on board the vessels.</i>
<b>lattice</b>	An interlaced structure or pattern resembling a lattice. <i>Honeysuckle was growing up a <b>lattice</b> round the door.</i>
<b>load</b>	Place a load or large quantity of something on or in a vehicle ship container etc. <i>I just went down to the store and <b>loaded</b> up on beer.</i>
<b>lug</b>	Ancient Celtic god. <i>Don't worry about <b>lugging</b> the kids to the salon with you.</i>
<b>mallet</b>	A hammer with a large, usually wooden head.
<b>plank</b>	Cook and serve on a plank. <i>He had <b>planked</b> 1 000 under the mattress.</i>
<b>risen</b>	(of e.g. celestial bodies) above the horizon. <i>The <b>risen</b> sun.</i>
<b>roof</b>	Function as the roof of. <i>The rain woke him hammering on the <b>roof</b>.</i>
<b>rung</b>	A horizontal support on a ladder for a person's foot. <i>We must ensure that the low skilled do not get trapped on the bottom <b>rung</b>.</i>
<b>scale</b>	Remove the scales from. <i>The skin may <b>scale</b> and peel away with itching stinging or burning sensations in the infected area.</i>
<b>shin</b>	The inner and thicker of the two bones of the human leg between the knee and ankle. <i>He <b>shinned</b> up a tree.</i>
<b>square</b>	A square scarf. <i>Faced with such declarations politicians were resolved to squash or <b>square</b> the press.</i>
<b>stairs</b>	A flight of stairs or a flight of steps.
<b>stepladder</b>	A short folding ladder with flat steps and a small platform.
<b>top</b>	The top or extreme point of something usually a mountain or hill. <i>They <b>topped</b> a rise and began a slow descent.</i>
