| alpine | Relating to or denoting skiing downhill. <i>A collection of alpines and dwarf bulbs.</i> |
| ascend | (of a road or flight of steps) slope or lead up. <i>The road ascends to the loch.</i> |
| ascending | The act of changing location in an upward direction. <i>The ascending plane.</i> |
| ascent | A movement upward. <i>The first balloon ascent was in 1783.</i> |
| boost | Give a boost to be beneficial to. <i>He gave her a boost over the fence.</i> |
| clamber | Climb or move in an awkward and laborious way, typically using both hands and feet. <i>Reaching the crest was a real clamber.</i> |
| climb | A mountain hill or slope that is climbed. <i>The rate of climb can be set by the pilot.</i> |
| climber | An iron spike attached to the shoe to prevent slipping on ice when walking or climbing. <i>Climbers trained up fences and trellises.</i> |
| climbing | The sport or activity of climbing mountains or cliffs. <i>Climbing equipment.</i> |
| grading | Changing the ground level to a smooth horizontal or gently sloping surface. <i>What he disliked about teaching was all the grading he had to do.</i> |
| guided | Directed by remote control or by internal equipment. <i>A guided missile.</i> |
| hike | Increase (something, especially a price) sharply. <i>A five mile hike across rough terrain.</i> |

| hiking | The activity of going for long walks, especially across country. <i>She enjoys hiking and climbing in her spare time.</i> |
| jog | A spell of jogging. <i>The bus jogged and jolted.</i> |
| mount | A mounting consisting of a piece of metal as in a ring or other jewelry that holds a gem in place. <i>The costs mount up when you buy a home.</i> |
| mountaineer | A person who takes part in mountaineering. |
| mounting | The action of mounting something. <i>He pulled the curtain rail from its mounting.</i> |
| picnic | Have or take part in a picnic. <i>Marketing this product will be no picnic.</i> |
| plate | Cover an object with plates of metal for decoration protection or strength. <i>He pushed his empty plate to one side and sipped his wine.</i> |
| quadrangle | A four-sided polygon. |
| quadrilateral | Having four straight sides. |
| raise | Raise the level or amount of something. <i>Monoclonal antibodies raised against human lymphocytes.</i> |
| rise | The property possessed by a slope or surface that rises. <i>Non supervisory staff were given a 5 per cent rise.</i> |
| risen | Above the horizon. <i>The risen sun.</i> |
| size | Sort according to size. <i>Firms of all sizes.</i> |
| skiing | The action of travelling over snow on skis especially as a sport or recreation Competitive skiing falls into two categories Nordic cross country racing jumping and biathlon and Alpine downhill or straight racing and slalom racing round a series of markers. |
| stepladder | A folding portable ladder hinged at the top. |
| surmount | Get on top of; deal with successfully. <i>All manner of cultural differences were surmounted.</i> |
| trek | A haul of fish caught using a trek net. <i>Many licences are given to men who trek for sport rather than professional fishermen.</i> |
| uphill | Towards the top of a hill or slope. <i>Follow the track uphill.</i> |
