## Associations of "Scales" (30 Words)

<b>alpine</b>	Relating to or denoting skiing downhill. <i>A collection of <b>alpines</b> and dwarf bulbs.</i>
<b>ascend</b>	(of a road or flight of steps) slope or lead up. <i>The road <b>ascends</b> to the loch.</i>
<b>ascending</b>	The act of changing location in an upward direction. <i>The <b>ascending</b> plane.</i>
<b>ascent</b>	A movement upward. <i>The first balloon <b>ascent</b> was in 1783.</i>
<b>boost</b>	Give a boost to be beneficial to. <i>He gave her a <b>boost</b> over the fence.</i>
<b>clamber</b>	Climb or move in an awkward and laborious way, typically using both hands and feet. <i>Reaching the crest was a real <b>clamber</b>.</i>
<a href="#">climb</a>	A mountain hill or slope that is climbed. <i>The rate of <b>climb</b> can be set by the pilot.</i>
<b>climber</b>	An iron spike attached to the shoe to prevent slipping on ice when walking or climbing. <i><b>Climbers</b> trained up fences and trellises.</i>
<a href="#">climbing</a>	The sport or activity of climbing mountains or cliffs. <i><b>Climbing</b> equipment.</i>
<b>grading</b>	Changing the ground level to a smooth horizontal or gently sloping surface. <i>What he disliked about teaching was all the <b>grading</b> he had to do.</i>
<b>guided</b>	Directed by remote control or by internal equipment. <i>A <b>guided</b> missile.</i>
<a href="#">hike</a>	Increase (something, especially a price) sharply. <i>A five mile <b>hike</b> across rough terrain.</i>

<b>hiking</b>	The activity of going for long walks, especially across country. <i>She enjoys <b>hiking</b> and climbing in her spare time.</i>
<b>jog</b>	A spell of jogging. <i>The bus <b>jogged</b> and jolted.</i>
<b>mount</b>	A mounting consisting of a piece of metal as in a ring or other jewelry that holds a gem in place. <i>The costs <b>mount</b> up when you buy a home.</i>
<b>mountaineer</b>	A person who takes part in mountaineering.
<b>mounting</b>	The action of mounting something. <i>He pulled the curtain rail from its <b>mounting</b>.</i>
<b>picnic</b>	Have or take part in a picnic. <i>Marketing this product will be no <b>picnic</b>.</i>
<b>plate</b>	Cover an object with plates of metal for decoration protection or strength. <i>He pushed his empty <b>plate</b> to one side and sipped his wine.</i>
<b>quadrangle</b>	A four-sided polygon.
<b>quadrilateral</b>	Having four straight sides.
<b>raise</b>	Raise the level or amount of something. <i>Monoclonal antibodies <b>raised</b> against human lymphocytes.</i>
<b>rise</b>	The property possessed by a slope or surface that rises. <i>Non supervisory staff were given a 5 per cent <b>rise</b>.</i>
<b>risen</b>	Above the horizon. <i>The <b>risen</b> sun.</i>
<b>size</b>	Sort according to size. <i>Firms of all <b>sizes</b>.</i>
<b>skiing</b>	The action of travelling over snow on skis especially as a sport or recreation Competitive skiing falls into two categories Nordic cross country racing jumping and biathlon and Alpine downhill or straight racing and slalom racing round a series of markers.
<b>stepladder</b>	A folding portable ladder hinged at the top.
<b>surmount</b>	Get on top of; deal with successfully. <i>All manner of cultural differences were <b>surmounted</b>.</i>
<b>trek</b>	A haul of fish caught using a trek net. <i>Many licences are given to men who <b>trek</b> for sport rather than professional fishermen.</i>
<b>uphill</b>	Towards the top of a hill or slope. <i>Follow the track <b>uphill</b>.</i>
