- A length or square of fabric worn around the neck or head.
- A garment worn around the head or neck or shoulders for warmth or decoration.

A long coat, typically having a belt, made from waterproofed or waterraincoat

Put on robes especially for a formal or ceremonial occasion. robe

A baby in christening **robe**s.

Put a shirt on.

Pass around or about; move along the border. skirt
