| <u>discourage</u> | Deprive of courage or hope take away hope from cause to feel discouraged. <i>Tedious regulations could discourage investors.</i> |
| dishearten | Cause (someone) to lose determination or confidence. The farmer was dishearten ed by the damage to his crops. |
| <u>dread</u> | Dreadlocks. The man whom Henry dread ed as the future champion of English freedom. |
| faze | Disturb or disconcert (someone. She was not faze d by his show of anger. |
| fear | Regard with feelings of respect and reverence; consider hallowed or exalted or be in awe of. <i>We should not fear the Communists.</i> |
| fearfulness | An emotion experienced in anticipation of some specific pain or danger (usually accompanied by a desire to flee or fight. |
| fearsome | Causing fear or dread or terror. The cat mewed displaying a fearsome set of teeth. |



| <u>formidable</u> | Inspiring fear. A formidable opponent. |

| fright | Frighten. I got the fright of my life seeing her in the hotel. |
| frighten | Drive out by frightening. Farmers are being frighten ed into scaling down their breeding plans. |
| <u>frightening</u> | Causing fear or dread or terror. A frightening experience. |
| <u>gaze</u> | A long fixed look. He fixed his paternal gaze on me. |
| <u>horrific</u> | Causing horror. <i>Horrific</i> injuries. |
| <u>horror</u> | Something that inspires horror something horrible. That little horror Zach was around. |
| intimidate | To compel or deter by or as if by threats. <i>Her boss intimidates her.</i> |
| <u>panic</u> | Feel or cause to feel panic. Panic selling. |
| petrify | Make rigid and set into a conventional pattern. <i>Slogans petrify our thinking.</i> |
| phobia | An extreme or irrational fear of or aversion to something. She suffered from a phobia about birds. |
| scared | Fearful; frightened. We re both scared of spiders. |
| scary | Uncannily striking or surprising. It was scary the way they bonded with each other. |
| <u>startle</u> | Cause to feel sudden shock or alarm. A sudden sound in the doorway startle d her. |
| terrify | Fill with terror; frighten greatly. <i>He is terrified of spiders.</i> |
| terror | Terrorism. A terror suspect. |
| unnerve | Make (someone) lose courage or confidence. The journey over the bridge had unnerve d me. |
