## Associations of "Scaring" (30 Words)

<b><a href="#">alarm</a></b>	An alarm clock. <i>The boat tilted and the boatmen cried out in <b>alarm</b>.</i>
<b><a href="#">alarming</a></b>	Worrying or disturbing. <i>Our countryside is disappearing at an <b>alarming</b> rate.</i>
<b>appall</b>	Fill with apprehension or alarm; cause to be unpleasantly surprised.
<b>browbeat</b>	Intimidate (someone), typically into doing something, with stern or abusive words. <i>A witness is being <b>browbeaten</b> under cross examination.</i>
<b><a href="#">chilling</a></b>	Horrifying or frightening. <i>A <b>chilling</b> account of the prisoners fate.</i>
<b>daunt</b>	Make (someone) feel intimidated or apprehensive. <i>Some people are <b>daunted</b> by technology.</i>
<b><a href="#">discourage</a></b>	Deprive of courage or hope take away hope from cause to feel discouraged. <i>Tedious regulations could <b>discourage</b> investors.</i>
<b>dishearten</b>	Cause (someone) to lose determination or confidence. <i>The farmer was <b>disheartened</b> by the damage to his crops.</i>
<b><a href="#">dread</a></b>	Dreadlocks. <i>The man whom Henry <b>dreaded</b> as the future champion of English freedom.</i>
<b>faze</b>	Disturb or disconcert (someone). <i>She was not <b>fazed</b> by his show of anger.</i>
<b>fear</b>	Regard with feelings of respect and reverence; consider hallowed or exalted or be in awe of. <i>We should not <b>fear</b> the Communists.</i>
<b>fearfulness</b>	An emotion experienced in anticipation of some specific pain or danger (usually accompanied by a desire to flee or fight).
<b>fearsome</b>	Causing fear or dread or terror. <i>The cat mewed displaying a <b>fearsome</b> set of teeth.</i>

<b><u>formidable</u></b>	Inspiring fear. A <b>formidable</b> opponent.
<b>fright</b>	Frighten. I got the <b>fright</b> of my life seeing her in the hotel.
<b>frighten</b>	Drive out by frightening. Farmers are being <b>frightened</b> into scaling down their breeding plans.
<b><u>frightening</u></b>	Causing fear or dread or terror. A <b>frightening</b> experience.
<b><u>gaze</u></b>	A long fixed look. He fixed his paternal <b>gaze</b> on me.
<b><u>horrific</u></b>	Causing horror. <b>Horrific</b> injuries.
<b><u>horror</u></b>	Something that inspires horror something horrible. That little <b>horror</b> Zach was around.
<b>intimidate</b>	To compel or deter by or as if by threats. Her boss <b>intimidates</b> her.
<b><u>panic</u></b>	Feel or cause to feel panic. <b>Panic</b> selling.
<b>petrify</b>	Make rigid and set into a conventional pattern. Slogans <b>petrify</b> our thinking.
<b>phobia</b>	An extreme or irrational fear of or aversion to something. She suffered from a <b>phobia</b> about birds.
<b>scared</b>	Fearful; frightened. We re both <b>scared</b> of spiders.
<b>scary</b>	Uncannily striking or surprising. It was <b>scary</b> the way they bonded with each other.
<b><u>startle</u></b>	Cause to feel sudden shock or alarm. A sudden sound in the doorway <b>startled</b> her.
<b>terrify</b>	Fill with terror; frighten greatly. He is terrified of spiders.
<b>terror</b>	Terrorism. A <b>terror</b> suspect.
<b>unnerve</b>	Make (someone) lose courage or confidence. The journey over the bridge had <b>unnerved</b> me.
