- high colour** A forward gear with a gear ratio that gives the greatest vehicle velocity for a given engine speed.

- redness** A response of body tissues to injury or irritation characterized by pain and swelling and redness and heat.  
*Treatment for facial redness.*

**rosiness** A rosy color (especially in the cheeks) taken as a sign of good health.

**ruddiness** A healthy reddish complexion.

**vermilion** A brilliant red colour.  
*Vermilion streaks of sunset.*

- *Of a color at the end of the color spectrum (next to orange); resembling the color of blood or cherries or tomatoes or rubies.*

- claret red** Reddened or suffused with or as if with blood from emotion or exertion.
- crimson** Reddened or suffused with or as if with blood from emotion or exertion.  
*Writes of **crimson** deeds and barbaric days.*
- red** Of wine made from dark grapes and coloured by their skins.  
***Red** battle stamps his foot and nations feel the shock.*
- reddish** Having a red tinge; slightly red.  
*The leaves turn **reddish** brown.*
- ruby** Of a color at the end of the color spectrum (next to orange); resembling the color of blood or cherries or tomatoes or rubies.
- ruby red** Of a color at the end of the color spectrum (next to orange); resembling the color of blood or cherries or tomatoes or rubies.
- ruby-red** Of a color at the end of the color spectrum (next to orange); resembling the color of blood or cherries or tomatoes or rubies.
- ruddy** Used as a euphemism for 'bloody'.  
*Young people today they re a **ruddy** shower.*
- vermilion** Of a vivid red to reddish-orange color.

### apple

The tree bearing apples with hard pale timber that is used in carpentry and to smoke food.

### [berry](#)

A small fruit having any of various structures e g simple grape or blueberry or aggregate blackberry or raspberry.

*We went **berrying** in the summer.*

### blueberry

Sweet edible dark blue berries of either low growing or high growing blueberry plants.

### brownish

Of a color similar to that of wood or earth.

*Where I live the soil is **brownish** red.*

### carmine

Color carmine.

### cherry

The tree that bears the cherry.

*She pulled up the collar of her **cherry** wool coat.*

<b>colored</b>	Having color or a certain color; sometimes used in combination. <i>Amber <b>colored</b> heads of grain.</i>
<b><u>crimson</u></b>	A deep and vivid red color. <i>My face <b>crimsoned</b> and my hands began to shake.</i>
<b>doublet</b>	A man's close-fitting jacket; worn during the Renaissance. <i>They were wearing red velvet <b>doublets</b> and hose.</i>
<b><u>fruit</u></b>	Bear fruit. <i>We give thanks for the <b>fruits</b> of the earth.</i>
<b>gray</b>	The SI unit of energy absorbed from ionizing radiation equal to the absorption of one joule of radiation energy by one kilogram of matter one gray equals 100 rad. <i><b>Gray</b> flannel suit.</i>
<b>green</b>	Green colour or pigment. <i><b>Green</b> shoots.</i>
<b>japonica</b>	An Asian shrub of the rose family, with bright red flowers followed by round white, green, or yellow edible fruits.
<b>maple</b>	Wood of any of various maple trees especially the hard close grained wood of the sugar maple used especially for furniture and flooring.
<b><u>orange</u></b>	Round yellow to orange fruit of any of several citrus trees. <i>A slice of <b>orange</b>.</i>
<b><u>painted</u></b>	Wearing make-up or cosmetics. <i>Brazen <b>painted</b> faces.</i>
<b>peach</b>	A pinkish yellow colour like that of a peach. <i>The sky began to change from grey to <b>peach</b>.</i>
<b>pear</b>	The Eurasian tree which bears the pear.
<b>picking</b>	The act of picking crops or fruit or hops etc. <i>He sent the first <b>picking</b> of berries to the market.</i>
<b>pigmentation</b>	The deposition of pigment in animals or plants or human beings.
<b>pimpernel</b>	European garden herb with purple-tinged flowers and leaves that are sometimes used for salads.
<b><u>purple</u></b>	A purple color or pigment. <i>Edmund s cheeks <b>purpled</b>.</i>
<b>red</b>	A red ball in snooker or billiards. <i>Which dress the black or the <b>red</b>.</i>
<b><u>rose</u></b>	The flower of a rose bush. <i>The 100 cotton range is available in <b>rose</b> pink and ocean blue.</i>



- roseate** Used in names of birds with partly pink plumage e g roseate tern.  
*His letters home give a very good although somewhat too **roseate** idea of how he lived.*
- ruddy** Make ruddy in colour.  
*A **ruddy** complexion.*
- strawberry** The low growing plant which produces the strawberry having white flowers lobed leaves and runners and found throughout north temperate regions.  
*She thought she would wear the **strawberry** crushed velvet.*
- tulip** A bulbous spring-flowering plant of the lily family, with boldly coloured cup-shaped flowers.
- walnut** The tall tree which produces walnuts with compound leaves and valuable ornamental timber that is used chiefly in cabinetmaking and gun stocks.
- yellow** A yellow ball or piece in a game or sport especially the yellow ball in snooker.  
*The cream paint was beginning to **yellow**.*
