Associations of "Scarred" (30 Words)

An event that happens by chance or that is without apparent or deliberate

accident cause.

The pregnancy was an accident.

Have a desire for something or someone who is not present. ache

My legs **ache**d from the previous day s exercise.

A dull persistent (usually moderately intense) pain. aching

My **aching** head.

afflicted Mentally or physically unfit.

Battle or contend against in or as if in a battle. **battle**

Grant won a decisive victory in the **battle** of Chickamauga.



bleeding Used for emphasis, or to express annoyance.

She looks so **bleeding** bored all day.

bruise Inflict a bruise or bruises on a part of the body.

I will admit that my pride was **bruise**d by his comment.

casualty Someone injured or killed in an accident.

He went to **casualty** to have a cut stitched.

damage Suffer or be susceptible to damage.

How much is the **damage**.

damaged Harmed or injured or spoiled.

I won t buy damaged goods.

disfigure Spoil the appearance of.

The vandals **disfigure**d the statue.

Impaired in function; especially of a bodily system or organ.

Dysfunctional families.

fatality A death resulting from an accident or a disaster.

A sense of **fatality** gripped her.

harm Cause or do harm to.

This could **harm** his World Cup prospects.

hurt Hurt the feelings of.

Ow You re **hurt**ing me.

impaired Mentally or physically unfit.

An **impaired** banking system.

injure Suffer physical harm or damage to (a part of one's body.

He **injure**d his back helping the girl.

injured Emotionally hurt or upset or annoyed.

Injured feelings.

irreversibly In a way that cannot be undone or altered.

Our landscape will be **irreversibly** damaged.

lacerate Having edges that are jagged from injury.

The point had **lacerate**d his neck.

Blemished by injury or rough wear.

Walls **marred** by graffiti.

mentally In a manner relating to the mind.

Soldiers become physically and **mentally** exhausted.

painfully In a painful manner or to a painful degree.

His ignorance was **painfully** obvious.



sepsis

Restore (someone) to health or normal life by training and therapy after

rehabilitate imprisonment, addiction, or illness.

The campaign aims to **rehabilitate** the river s flood plain.

A serious condition resulting from the presence of harmful microorganisms

in the blood or other tissues and the body's response to their presence,

potentially leading to the malfunctioning of various organs, shock, and

death.

sore Extremely; severely.

They were **sore** afraid.

suffer Undergo or suffer.

He **suffer**ed the penalty.

twinge A sudden, sharp localized pain.

Kate felt a **twinge** of guilt.

unrepaired Unserviceable because necessary repairs have not been made.

People who are wounded.

wounded
They had to leave the wounded where they fell.
