Definitions of "Scent" as a noun

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “scent” as a noun can have the following definitions:

- *Any property detected by the olfactory system.*
- *Pleasant-smelling liquid worn on the skin; perfume.*
- *An odor left in passing by which a person or animal can be traced.*
- *A trail indicated by the characteristic smell of an animal and perceptible to hounds or other animals.*
- *A trail of evidence or other signs assisting someone in a search or investigation.*
- *A distinctive smell, especially one that is pleasant.*
- *A distinctive odor that is pleasant.*
- *The faculty or sense of smell.*

redolence	A pleasingly sweet olfactory property.
savour	The taste experience when a savoury condiment is taken into the mouth. <i>The subtle savour of wood smoke.</i>
smell	A quality in something that is perceived by the faculty of smell an odour or scent. <i>A highly developed sense of smell.</i>
spoor	The track of a wagon or motor vehicle. <i>They searched around the hut for a spoor.</i>
toilet water	The act of dressing and preparing yourself.
track	The soundtrack of a film or video. <i>Follow the track to the farm.</i>
trail	A trailer for a film or broadcast. <i>A tear left its trail on her cheek.</i>
whiff	A strikeout resulting from the batter swinging at and missing the ball for the third strike. <i>Whiffs of smoke emerged from the boiler.</i>

odorize	Give an odour or scent to. <i>Clean or odorized air from the flow valves is delivered to a mask.</i>
odourise	Cause to smell or be smelly.
<u>perceive</u>	To become aware of through the senses. <i>He perceived the faintest of flushes creeping up her neck.</i>
<u>perfume</u>	Impregnate with perfume or a sweet smelling substance. <i>The cream is perfumed with rosemary and iris extracts.</i>
perfumed	Apply perfume to.
pick up the smell of	Pay for something.
recognize	Grant diplomatic recognition to (a country or government). <i>The best student was recognized by the Dean.</i>
sense	Become aware of not through the senses but instinctively. <i>She could sense her father's anger rising.</i>
smell	Smell bad. <i>It smelled like cough medicine.</i>
sniff out	Perceive by inhaling through the nose.
test the smell of	Put to the test, as for its quality, or give experimental use to.
wind	Make a baby bring up wind after feeding by patting its back. <i>The birds could not have seen us or winded us.</i>

- *The Premier scented victory last night.*
- *A shark can scent blood from well over half a kilometre away.*
- *A glass of tea scented with a local herb.*

musky	Resembling the smell of musk.
nectary	A gland (often a protuberance or depression) that secretes nectar.
odoriferous	Morally offensive. <i>An odoriferous pile of fish.</i>
odorous	Emitting an odor. <i>A dark and odorous cave.</i>
perfume	Apply perfume to. <i>She perfumes herself every day.</i>
pudding	A cooked sweet dish served after the main course of a meal. <i>A steak and kidney pudding.</i>
