A feeling of extreme pleasure or satisfaction. delight

The new car is a **delight**.

Great happiness and exhilaration. elation

Richard s **elation** at regaining his health was short lived.

A feeling or state of intense excitement and happiness. **euphoria**

In his **euphoria** he had become convinced he could defeat them.

The feeling of lively and cheerful joy. exhilaration

They felt the **exhilaration** of victory.

gladness Experiencing joy and pleasure.



State of well-being characterized by emotions ranging from contentment to

happiness intense joy.

She struggled to find **happiness** in her life.

jocularity Activity characterized by good humor.

jollity The quality of being cheerful.

A night of riotous jollity.

joviality Feeling jolly and jovial and full of good humor.

joy A thing that causes joy. The **joy** of being alive.

joyfulness The emotion of great happiness.

merriment Activities that are enjoyable or amusing.

Her eyes sparkled with **merriment**.

mirth Amusement, especially as expressed in laughter.

His six foot frame shook with **mirth**.

mirthfulness Great merriment.

A fundamental feeling that is hard to define but that people desire to

pleasure experience.

The touch of his fingers gave her such **pleasure**.
