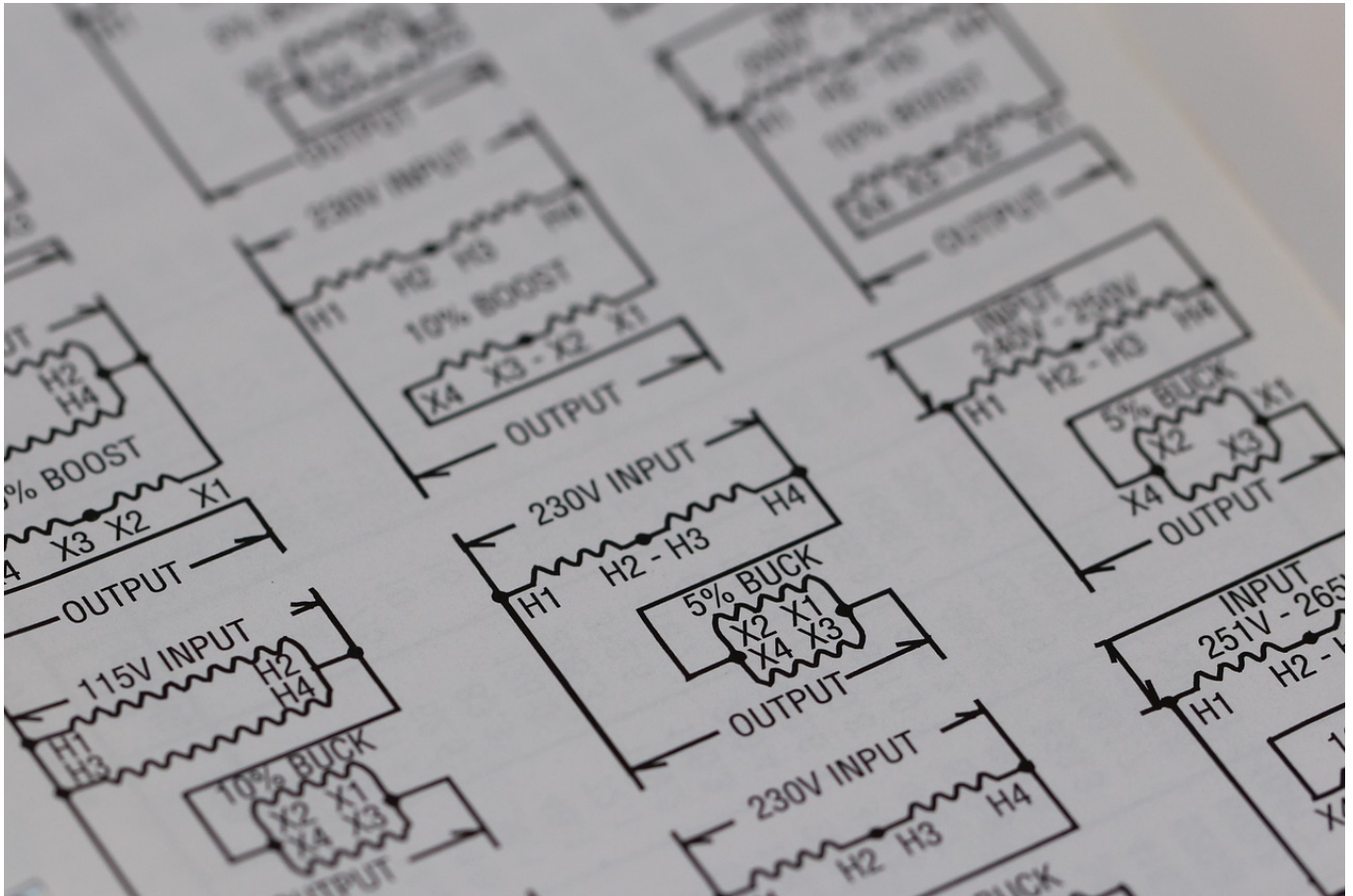

- *(in technical contexts) a schematic diagram, in particular of an electric or electronic circuit.*



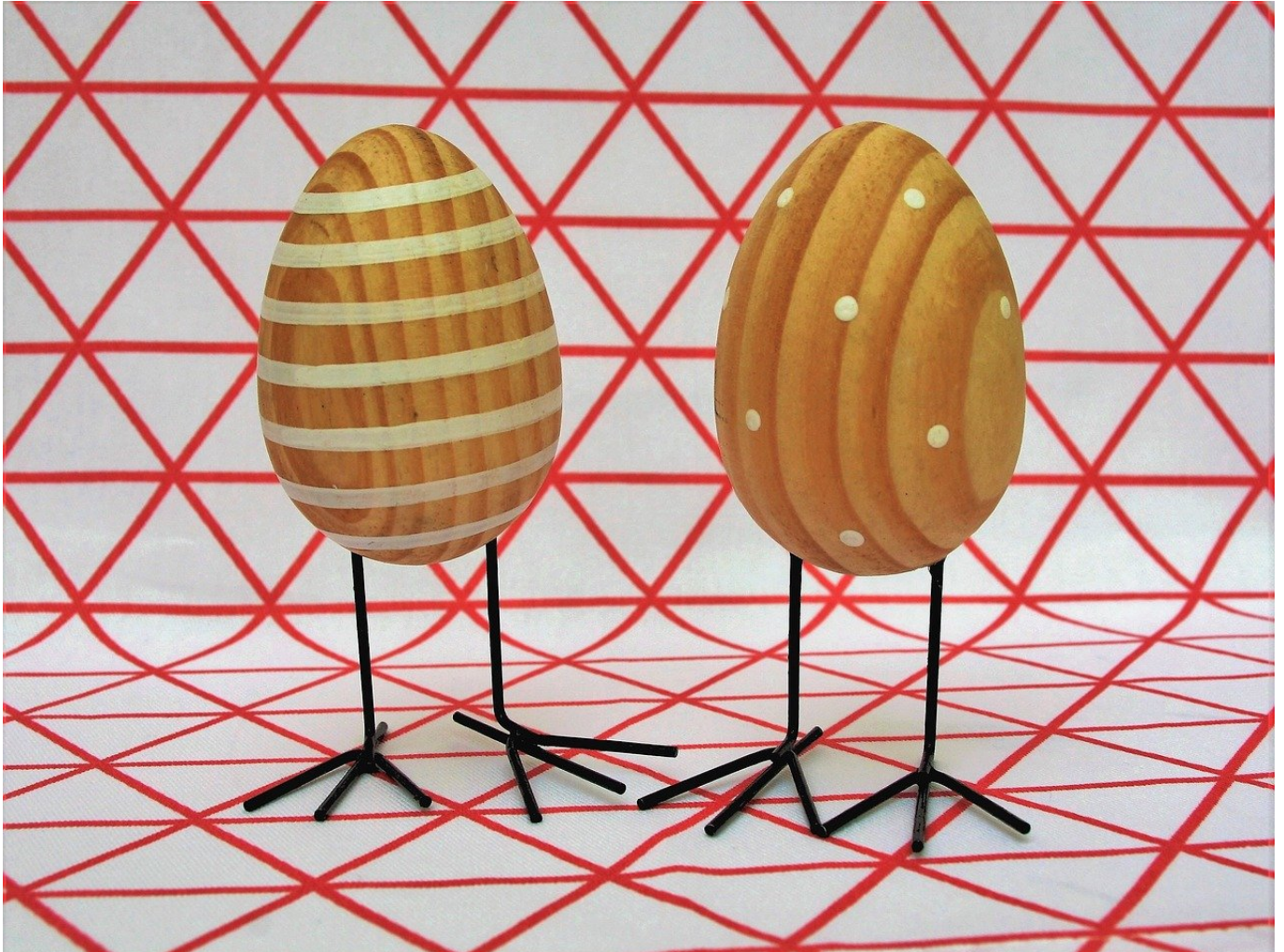
Synonyms of "Schematic" as a noun (1 Word)

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), "schematic" as an adjective can have the following definitions:

- *Represented in simplified or symbolic form.*
- *(of a diagram or other representation) symbolic and simplified.*
- *(of thought, ideas, etc.) simplistic or formulaic in character.*



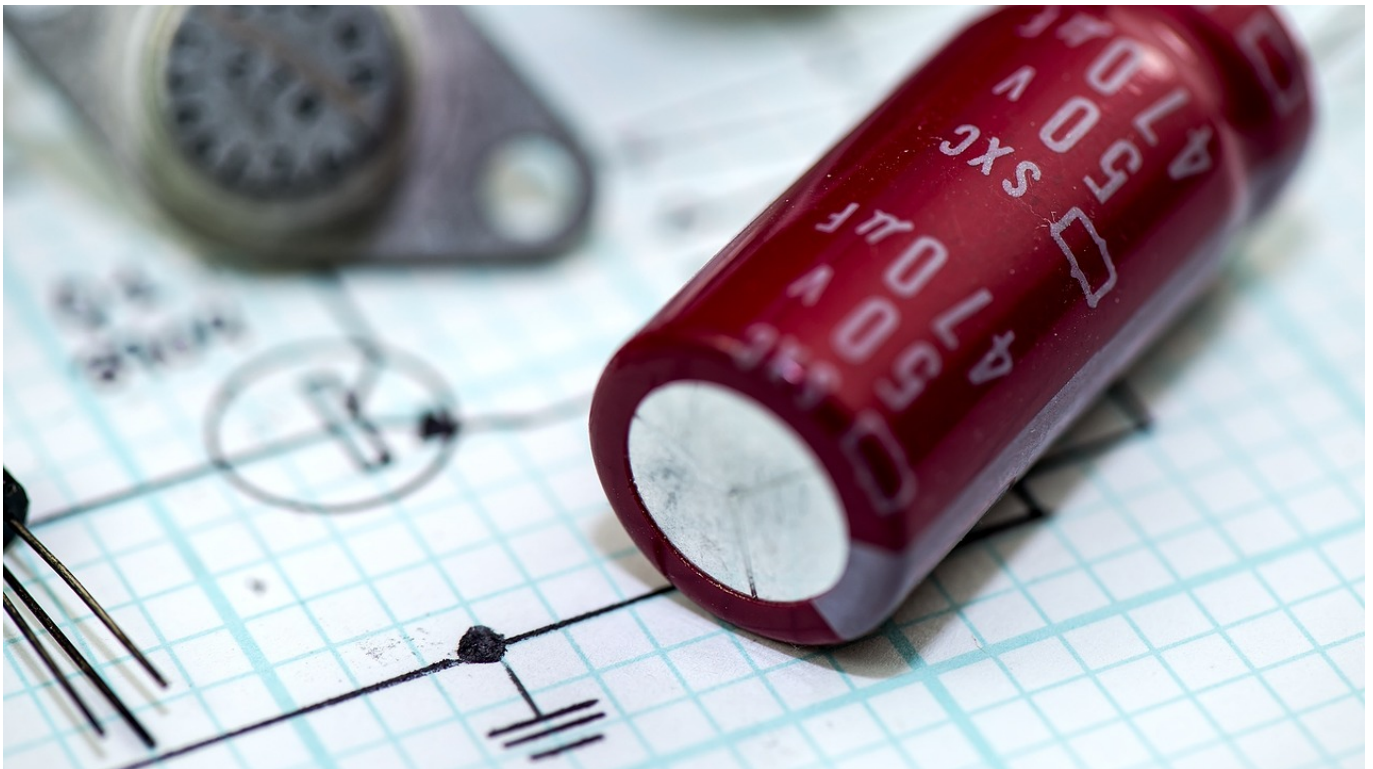
Synonyms of "Schematic" as an adjective (7 Words)

- conventional** (of a bid) intended to convey a particular meaning according to an agreed convention.
*West made a **conventional** bid showing a hand with at least 5 spades.*
- formal** Being in accord with established forms and conventions and requirements as e.g. of formal dress.
*A **formal** dinner party.*
- formulaic** Constituting or containing a set form of words.
***Formulaic** disposable pop.*
- oversimple** Lacking sophistication and subtlety.
*An **oversimple** theory of human nature.*

oversimplified Simplified to such an extent that a distorted impression is given.
*An **oversimplified** view of human personality.*

simplistic Treating complex issues and problems as if they were much simpler than they really are.
*A **simplistic** theory of the universe.*

unimaginative Dealing only with concrete facts.
*He was an **unimaginative** leader.*



Usage Examples of "Schematic" as an adjective

- *Freeman constructs a highly schematic reading of the play.*
- *This concept is shown in schematic form in Figure 1.*
- *Schematic diagrams.*

Associations of "Schematic" (30 Words)

architect Someone who creates plans to be used in making something (such as buildings).
*The **architects** of the reform programme.*

artwork	Photographs or other visual representations in a printed publication. <i>The technology can produce finished artwork for anything from press ads to corporate brochures.</i>
<u>blueprint</u>	Make a blueprint of. <i>The landscape architect blueprinted a ten year plan for regeneration of the magnificent formal gardens.</i>
cartography	The making of maps and charts.
<u>chart</u>	Plot a course on a chart. <i>The pilot found his craft taking a route he had not charted.</i>
chiaroscuro	An effect of contrasted light and shadow. <i>The chiaroscuro of cobbled streets.</i>
crayon	Draw with a crayon or crayons. <i>A child crayoning in a colouring book.</i>
<u>diagram</u>	Schedule the operations of a locomotive or train according to a diagram. <i>A diagram of the living room.</i>
draft	Select a player for a sports team through the draft. <i>He took a sleeping draft.</i>
draftsmanship	The creation of artistic pictures or diagrams.
<u>drawing</u>	The art or activity of making drawings. <i>Drawings of abstract forms.</i>
exploded	(of a diagram) showing the components of a mechanism in the normal relative positions but slightly separated from each other. <i>Teams are analysing fragments from the two exploded bombs.</i>
flowchart	A diagram of the sequence of operations in a computer program or an accounting system.
graffiti	Write or draw graffiti on something. <i>He graffitied his tag on a window and door.</i>
<u>graph</u>	Plot upon a graph.
<u>graphic</u>	Of or relating to the graphic arts British Book News. <i>A graphic account of the riots.</i>
<u>imagery</u>	Visual images collectively. <i>The film s religious imagery.</i>
machination	A plot or scheme.
<u>maneuver</u>	A military training exercise. <i>She maneuvered herself into the directorship.</i>
map	Depict as if on a map. <i>Map the genes.</i>

mimesis	The deliberate imitation of the behaviour of one group of people by another group as a factor in social change. <i>Barth has always detached his use of plot from mimesis.</i>
mimetic	Exhibiting mimicry. <i>The mimetic tendency of infancy.</i>
painting	The occupation of a house painter. <i>An oil painting.</i>
picture	Represent in a photograph or picture. <i>The author gives a depressing picture of life in Poland.</i>
plat	Make a plat of. <i>He bought back the site platted it and named it after his realtor.</i>
plot	The main events of a play, novel, film, or similar work, devised and presented by the writer as an interrelated sequence. <i>The dependent variable s points are plotted on the Y axis.</i>
representation	A statement or allegation. <i>A striking representation of a vase of flowers.</i>
smoothed	Made smooth by ironing.
strategically	In a way that relates to the achievement of long-term or overall aims and interests. <i>Strategically important ports.</i>
technicolor	A trademarked method of making color motion pictures.
