**bookman** A learned person (especially in the humanities); someone who by long study has gained mastery in one or more disciplines.

**learner** A person who is learning a subject or skill.  
*A fast **learner**.*

**student** A person who takes an interest in a particular subject.  
*A **student** of sociology.*

**academician** Someone elected to honorary membership in an academy.

**admired** Regarded with admiration.

<b>analytic</b>	Using or skilled in using analysis (i.e., separating a whole-intellectual or substantial-into its elemental parts or basic principles. <i>An <b>analytic</b> experiment.</i>
<b>annalist</b>	A historian who writes annals.
<b>archaeology</b>	The study of human history and prehistory through the excavation of sites and the analysis of artefacts and other physical remains.
<b>dialectician</b>	A logician skilled in dialectic.
<u><b>disciple</b></u>	A personal follower of Christ during his life, especially one of the twelve Apostles. <i>A <b>disciple</b> of Rousseau.</i>
<b>economist</b>	An expert in the science of economics.
<b>geometer</b>	A geometrid moth or its caterpillar.
<u><b>historian</b></u>	A person who is an authority on history and who studies it and writes about it. <i>A military <b>historian</b>.</i>
<b>logician</b>	A person skilled at symbolic logic. <i>A leading mathematical <b>logician</b>.</i>
<b>mathematician</b>	A person skilled in mathematics. <i>One of the world's foremost theoretical <b>mathematicians</b>.</i>
<b>metallurgical</b>	Of or relating to metallurgy. <i><b>Metallurgical</b> engineer.</i>
<u><b>philosopher</b></u>	A specialist in philosophy.
<b>philosophy</b>	A belief (or system of beliefs) accepted as authoritative by some group or school. <i>The <b>philosophy</b> of science.</i>
<b>physicist</b>	A scientist trained in physics.
<u><b>professor</b></u>	An associate professor or an assistant professor. <i>A <b>professor</b> of Art History.</i>
<b>researcher</b>	A scientist who devotes himself to doing research. <i>A medical <b>researcher</b> who pioneered the development of antibiotics.</i>
<u><b>scientist</b></u>	A person with advanced knowledge of one or more sciences. <i>A research <b>scientist</b>.</i>
<b>sinologist</b>	A student of Chinese history and language and culture.
<b>sociologist</b>	An expert in or student of the development, structure, and functioning of human society. <i>Historians and <b>sociologists</b> are still split on the matter.</i>
<b>sophism</b>	A clever but false argument, especially one used deliberately to deceive.

<b>sophist</b>	A person who reasons with clever but false arguments.
<b>sophistry</b>	The use of clever but false arguments, especially with the intention of deceiving. <i>Trying to argue that I had benefited in any way from the disaster was pure <b>sophistry</b>.</i>
<b>specialist</b>	Concentrating on a restricted field, market, or area of activity. <i>A <b>specialist</b> electrical shop.</i>
<b>statistician</b>	A mathematician who specializes in statistics.
<b>study</b>	A thing that is or deserves to be investigated the subject of an individual s study. <i>A complex <b>study</b> of a gay teenager.</i>
<b>syllogistic</b>	Of or relating to or consisting of syllogism.
<b>taxonomist</b>	A biologist who specializes in the classification of organisms into groups on the basis of their structure and origin and behavior.
<b>taxonomy</b>	Study of the general principles of scientific classification. <i>The <b>taxonomy</b> of these fossils.</i>
