### **Definitions of "Scientist" as a noun**

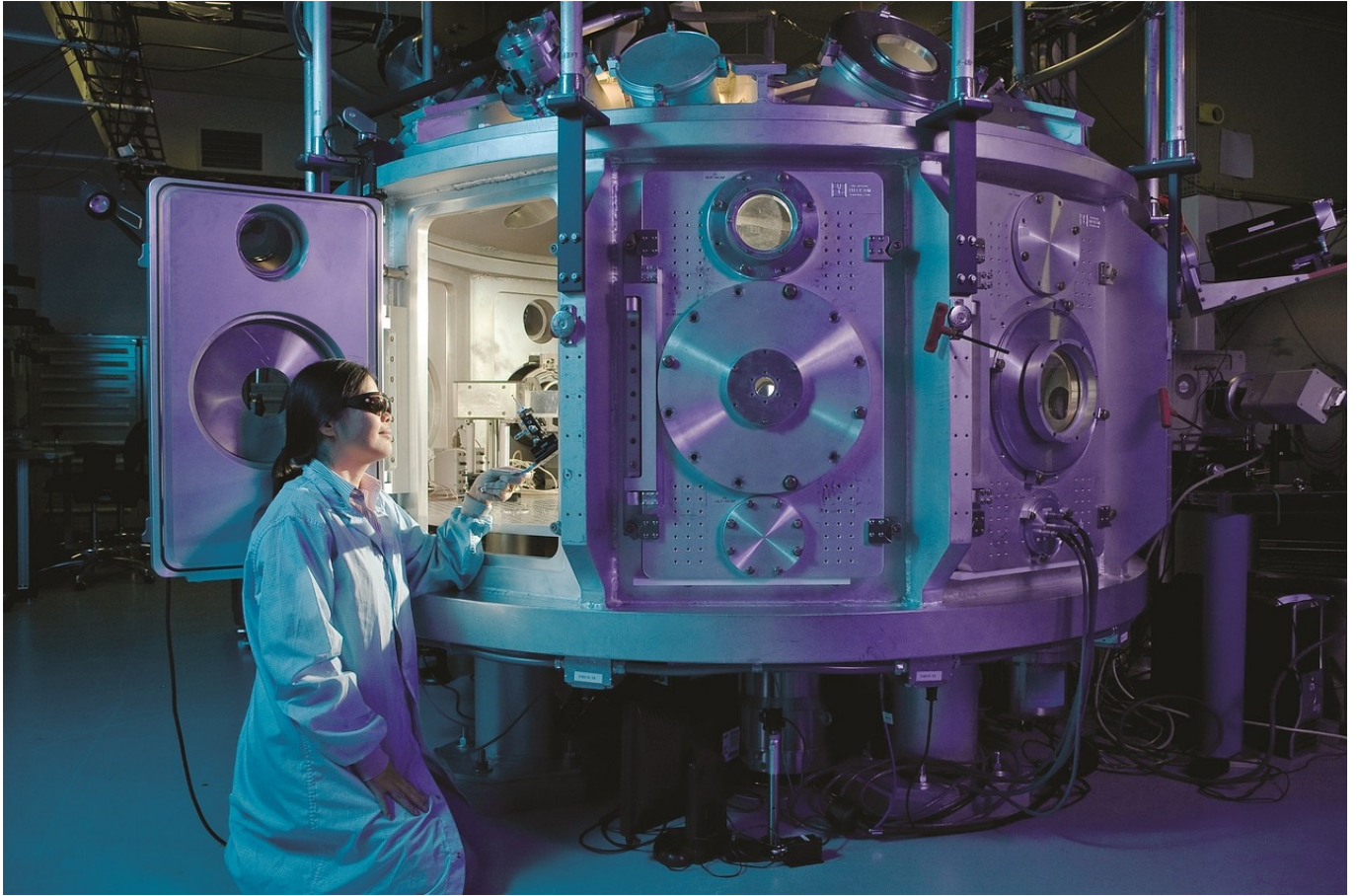
According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “scientist” as a noun can have the following definitions:

- *A person with advanced knowledge of one or more sciences.*

- researcher** A person who carries out academic or scientific research.  
*A medical **researcher** who pioneered the development of antibiotics.*
- technologist** An expert in a particular field of technology.  
*Chief **technologist** for internet security.*

## Associations of "Scientist" (30 Words)

<b>analysis</b>	A branch of mathematics involving calculus and the theory of limits; sequences and series and integration and differentiation. <i>Samples are sent to the laboratory for <b>analysis</b>.</i>
<b>assembler</b>	A person who assembles a machine or its parts.
<b>biotechnology</b>	The branch of engineering science in which biological science is used to study the relation between workers and their environments. <i><b>Biotechnology</b> produced genetically altered bacteria that solved the problem.</i>
<b>climatologist</b>	Someone who is expert in climatology.
<b>contrive</b>	Make or work out a plan for; devise. <i>You <b>contrived</b> to be alone with me despite the supervision.</i>
<b>create</b>	Create or manufacture a man made product. <i>He was <b>created</b> a baronet.</i>
<b>deducible</b>	Capable of being deduced.
<b>devise</b>	(law) a gift of real property by will. <i><b>Devise</b> a plan to take over the director s office.</i>
<b>engineer</b>	Design as an engineer. <i>The men who <b>engineered</b> the tunnel.</i>
<b>experiment</b>	The act of conducting a controlled test or investigation. <i>A laboratory which carried out <b>experiments</b> on pigs.</i>
<b>experimentation</b>	The testing of an idea. <i>After <b>experimentation</b> in the laboratory the first vines of the new clone were planted.</i>
<b>experimenter</b>	A person who performs a scientific procedure, especially in a laboratory, to determine something. <i>Each participant was tested by a trained <b>experimenter</b>.</i>
<b>functionalist</b>	An adherent of functionalism.
<b>industry</b>	The organized action of making of goods and services for sale. <i>New investment incentives for British <b>industry</b>.</i>
<b>invent</b>	Come up with (an idea, plan, explanation, theory, or principle) after a mental effort. <i>I did not have to <b>invent</b> any tales about my past.</i>
<b>inventor</b>	Someone who is the first to think of or make something.
<b>lab</b>	A laboratory. <i>A science <b>lab</b>.</i>

<b>laboratory</b>	A region resembling a laboratory inasmuch as it offers opportunities for observation and practice and experimentation. <i>Pakistan is a <b>laboratory</b> for studying the use of American troops to combat terrorism.</i>
<b>manufacture</b>	Manufactured articles. <i>They <b>manufacture</b> small toys.</i>
<b>mathematician</b>	A person skilled in mathematics. <i>One of the world's foremost theoretical <b>mathematicians</b>.</i>
<b>physicist</b>	A scientist trained in physics.
<b>reactant</b>	A chemical substance that is present at the start of a chemical reaction.
<b>research</b>	Engaged in or intended for research. <i>The group carries out <b>research</b> in geochemistry.</i>
<b>researcher</b>	A person whose job involves discovering or verifying information for use in a book, programme, etc. <i>A medical <b>researcher</b> who pioneered the development of antibiotics.</i>
<b>robotics</b>	The branch of technology that deals with the design, construction, operation, and application of robots. <i>Civilian research on <b>robotics</b> is advancing swiftly.</i>
<b>scholar</b>	A student who holds a scholarship. <i>A Hebrew <b>scholar</b>.</i>
<b>science</b>	A particular area of science. <i>The <b>science</b> of genetics.</i>
<b>statistician</b>	A mathematician who specializes in statistics.
<b>technician</b>	Someone known for high skill in some intellectual or artistic technique. <i>Liszt was one of the greatest piano <b>technicians</b> of all time.</i>
<b>toolmaker</b>	Someone skilled in making or repairing tools.
