Associations of "Scrambling" (30 Words)

<u>abrupt</u>	Steep; precipitous. <i>You were rather abrupt with that young man.</i>
celerity	A rate that is rapid.
dash	A small amount of a quality that adds piquancy or distinctiveness to something else. <i>I dashed into the garden.</i>
fast	(of a surface) allowing or producing high-speed movement. <i>The dyes are boiled with the yarn to produce a fast colour.</i>
fastness	A secure place well protected by natural features. <i>A remote Himalayan mountain fastness.</i>
hare	Run quickly like a hare. <i>He hared down the hill.</i>
<u>haste</u>	A condition of urgency making it necessary to hurry. <i>I write in haste.</i>
hastily	With excessive speed or urgency; hurriedly. <i>Maybe I acted too hastily.</i>
hie	Move hurriedly. <i>I hied down to New Orleans.</i>
hurried	Done in a hurry; rushed. <i>A hurried job.</i>
hurriedly	In a quick or rushed manner. <i>He hurriedly packed his things and left.</i>
hurry	A condition of urgency making it necessary to hurry. <i>In a hurry to lock the door.</i>
<u>hustle</u>	Push roughly; jostle. <i>The secret service agents hustled the speaker out of the amphitheater.</i>

overhasty	Done with very great haste and without due deliberation- Shakespeare- Arthur Geddes. <i>Rejected what was regarded as an overhasty plan for reconversion.</i>
precipitant	A cause or stimulus which precipitates a particular condition. <i>A protein precipitant.</i>
quick	Moving quickly and lightly. <i>Get out quick.</i>
quicken	Make or become faster or quicker. <i>I felt my pulse quicken.</i>
quickly	At a fast speed; rapidly. <i>He works quickly.</i>
rapidly	Very quickly; at a great rate. <i>The business is expanding rapidly.</i>
rush	Cause to move fast or to rush or race. <i>Don t rush me please.</i>
rushed	Done under pressure. <i>A rushed job.</i>
rushing	The action of advancing rapidly towards an opposing player, especially the quarterback. <i>Rushing is a popular option for first and second year students.</i>
shin	Climb quickly up or down by gripping with one's arms and legs. <i>He shinned up a tree.</i>
shove	A strong push. <i>I should have told the boss to shove it.</i>
speedily	With rapid movements. <i>Your claim will be dealt with as speedily as possible.</i>
sprint	A quick run. <i>The 100 metres sprint.</i>
struggle	Strenuous effort. <i>Before she could struggle he lifted her up.</i>
swift	Swiftly. <i>A remarkably swift recovery.</i>
swiftness	A rate (usually rapid) at which something happens. <i>Kay had the upper hand with her agility and swiftness.</i>
urgently	With great urgency. <i>Housing is urgently needed.</i>
