## Associations of "Scrambling" (30 Words)

<a href="#">abrupt</a>	Steep; precipitous. <i>You were rather <b>abrupt</b> with that young man.</i>
<b>celerity</b>	A rate that is rapid.
<b>dash</b>	A small amount of a quality that adds piquancy or distinctiveness to something else. <i>I <b>dashed</b> into the garden.</i>
<b>fast</b>	(of a surface) allowing or producing high-speed movement. <i>The dyes are boiled with the yarn to produce a <b>fast</b> colour.</i>
<b>fastness</b>	A secure place well protected by natural features. <i>A remote Himalayan mountain <b>fastness</b>.</i>
<b>hare</b>	Run quickly like a hare. <i>He <b>hared</b> down the hill.</i>
<a href="#">haste</a>	A condition of urgency making it necessary to hurry. <i>I write in <b>haste</b>.</i>
<b>hastily</b>	With excessive speed or urgency; hurriedly. <i>Maybe I acted too <b>hastily</b>.</i>
<b>hie</b>	Move hurriedly. <i>I <b>hied</b> down to New Orleans.</i>
<b>hurried</b>	Done in a hurry; rushed. <i>A <b>hurried</b> job.</i>
<b>hurriedly</b>	In a quick or rushed manner. <i>He <b>hurriedly</b> packed his things and left.</i>
<b>hurry</b>	A condition of urgency making it necessary to hurry. <i>In a <b>hurry</b> to lock the door.</i>
<a href="#">hustle</a>	Push roughly; jostle. <i>The secret service agents <b>hustled</b> the speaker out of the amphitheater.</i>

<b>overhasty</b>	Done with very great haste and without due deliberation- Shakespeare- Arthur Geddes. <i>Rejected what was regarded as an <b>overhasty</b> plan for reconversion.</i>
<b>precipitant</b>	A cause or stimulus which precipitates a particular condition. <i>A protein <b>precipitant</b>.</i>
<b>quick</b>	Moving quickly and lightly. <i>Get out <b>quick</b>.</i>
<b>quicken</b>	Make or become faster or quicker. <i>I felt my pulse <b>quicken</b>.</i>
<b>quickly</b>	At a fast speed; rapidly. <i>He works <b>quickly</b>.</i>
<b>rapidly</b>	Very quickly; at a great rate. <i>The business is expanding <b>rapidly</b>.</i>
<b>rush</b>	Cause to move fast or to rush or race. <i>Don t <b>rush</b> me please.</i>
<b>rushed</b>	Done under pressure. <i>A <b>rushed</b> job.</i>
<b>rushing</b>	The action of advancing rapidly towards an opposing player, especially the quarterback. <i><b>Rushing</b> is a popular option for first and second year students.</i>
<b>shin</b>	Climb quickly up or down by gripping with one's arms and legs. <i>He <b>shinned</b> up a tree.</i>
<b>shove</b>	A strong push. <i>I should have told the boss to <b>shove</b> it.</i>
<b>speedily</b>	With rapid movements. <i>Your claim will be dealt with as <b>speedily</b> as possible.</i>
<b>sprint</b>	A quick run. <i>The 100 metres <b>sprint</b>.</i>
<b>struggle</b>	Strenuous effort. <i>Before she could <b>struggle</b> he lifted her up.</i>
<b>swift</b>	Swiftly. <i>A remarkably <b>swift</b> recovery.</i>
<b>swiftness</b>	A rate (usually rapid) at which something happens. <i>Kay had the upper hand with her agility and <b>swiftness</b>.</i>
<b>urgently</b>	With great urgency. <i>Housing is <b>urgently</b> needed.</i>
