- *Refuse separated by sieving grain.*
- *A showing of a film, video, or television programme.*
- *The evaluation or investigation of something as part of a methodical survey, to assess suitability for a particular role or purpose.*
- *Testing objects or persons in order to identify those with particular characteristics.*
- *The testing of a person or group of people for the presence of a disease or other condition.*

<b>cover</b>	Covering for a hole especially a hole in the top of a container. <i>Under <b>cover</b> of darkness.</i>
<b>covering</b>	The act of protecting something by covering it. <i>Under a <b>covering</b> of dust.</i>
<b>dissemination</b>	The act of dispersing or diffusing something. <i>The <b>dissemination</b> of public information.</i>
<b>examination</b>	The action or process of conducting an examination. <i>A medical <b>examination</b> is conducted without delay.</i>
<b>experiment</b>	A scientific procedure undertaken to make a discovery, test a hypothesis, or demonstrate a known fact. <i>As an <b>experiment</b> he decided to grow a beard.</i>

<b>masking</b>	A party of guests wearing costumes and masks. <i>He studied auditory <b>masking</b> by pure tones.</i>
<b>pilot study</b>	Small auxiliary gas burner that provides a flame to ignite a larger gas burner.
<b>relaying</b>	The act of passing something along from one person or group to another.
<b>showing</b>	The action of showing something or the fact of being shown. <i>Alsatian dog championship quality excellent results in <b>showing</b>.</i>
<b>telecast</b>	A television broadcast.
<b><u>transmission</u></b>	The act of sending a message; causing a message to be transmitted. <i>A three speed automatic <b>transmission</b>.</i>
<b><u>trial</u></b>	A preliminary competition to determine qualifications. <i>His mother in law s visits were a great <b>trial</b> for him.</i>
<b>viewing</b>	The action of inspecting or looking at something. <i>The owner may allow <b>viewing</b> by appointment.</i>

<b>camera</b>	Equipment for taking photographs (usually consisting of a lightproof box with a lens at one end and light-sensitive film at the other. <i>A video <b>camera</b>.</i>
<b>cinema</b>	A theater where films are shown. <i>I was weaned on a diet of Hollywood fantasy at my local <b>cinema</b>.</i>
<b>clip</b>	A piece of jewellery fastened by a clip. <i>A gilt <b>clip</b> fastened her hair.</i>
<b>display</b>	Attract attention by displaying some body part or posing of animals. <i>Both players <b>displayed</b> a great deal of spirit.</i>
<b>easel</b>	A wooden frame for holding an artist's work while it is being painted or drawn.
<b>enlarger</b>	An apparatus for enlarging or reducing negatives or positives.
<b>exhibit</b>	Give an exhibition of to an interested audience. <i>He <b>exhibits</b> a great talent.</i>
<b>exhibition</b>	A scholarship awarded to a student at a school or university, usually after a competitive examination. <i>Fields which have been ploughed with a supreme <b>exhibition</b> of the farm worker s skills.</i>
<b>expo</b>	A collection of things (goods or works of art etc.) for public display.
<b>film</b>	Be well or badly suited to portrayal in a film. <i><b>Films</b> of silk.</i>
<b>flowchart</b>	A diagram of the sequence of operations in a computer program or an accounting system.
<b>gallery</b>	A group of spectators, especially those at a golf tournament. <i>An extensive <b>gallery</b> of colour photographs.</i>
<b>matinee</b>	A theatrical performance held during the daytime (especially in the afternoon.
<b>movie</b>	A form of entertainment that enacts a story by sound and a sequence of images giving the illusion of continuous movement. <i>They went to a <b>movie</b> every Saturday night.</i>
<b>museum</b>	A depository for collecting and displaying objects having scientific or historical or artistic value. <i>It is difficult to avoid the feeling that the city is now a living <b>museum</b>.</i>
<b>performance</b>	The action or process of performing a task or function. <i>He stopped to fasten his shoelace and seemed to be making quite a <b>performance</b> of it.</i>

<b>picture</b>	Show in or as in a picture. <i>We were warned not to take <b>pictures</b>.</i>
<b>preview</b>	An opportunity to view something before it is acquired or becomes generally available. <i>In our <b>preview</b> of children s books we select some forthcoming titles.</i>
<b>projector</b>	An optical device for projecting a beam of light. <i>He was a tobacco grower and <b>projector</b>.</i>
<b>screen</b>	Conceal protect or shelter someone or something with a screen or something forming a screen. <i>They put <b>screens</b> in the windows for protection against insects.</i>
<b>showcase</b>	A place or occasion for presenting something favourably to general attention. <i>The albums <b>showcase</b> his production skills.</i>
<b>showing</b>	The action of showing something or the fact of being shown. <i>Despite poor opinion poll <b>showings</b> the party selected him as its candidate.</i>
<b>studio</b>	A studio flat. <i>All apartments and <b>studios</b> have private facilities.</i>
<b>theater</b>	A building where theatrical performances or motion-picture shows can be presented. <i>He served in the Vietnam <b>theater</b> for three years.</i>
<b>tripod</b>	A three-legged stand for supporting a camera or other apparatus.
<b>video</b>	Computer science the appearance of text and graphics on a video display. <i>A pop <b>video</b>.</i>
<b>viewing</b>	The action of inspecting or looking at something. <i>The film is quite unsuitable for family <b>viewing</b>.</i>
