<b>ascend</b>	Go up or climb. <i>The Prophet <b>ascended</b> to heaven.</i>
<b>ascending</b>	Moving or going or growing upward. <i>The <b>ascending</b> stems of chickweed.</i>
<b>ascent</b>	A climb or walk to the summit of a mountain or hill. <i>The <b>ascent</b> grew steeper.</i>
<b>boost</b>	Give a boost to be beneficial to. <i>He d had his wallet <b>boosted</b> in a bar.</i>
<a href="#"><b>climb</b></a>	A mountain hill or slope that is climbed. <i>The rate of <b>climb</b> can be set by the pilot.</i>
<a href="#"><b>climbing</b></a>	The sport or activity of climbing mountains or cliffs. <i>His other great interest was <b>climbing</b> especially in the Alps.</i>
<b>downstairs</b>	Situated downstairs. <i>I tripped over the cat and fell <b>downstairs</b>.</i>
<a href="#"><b>elevate</b></a>	Raise to a more important or impressive level. <i>The field guns were <b>elevated</b> twenty degrees.</i>
<b>elevator</b>	The airfoil on the tailplane of an aircraft that makes it ascend or descend. <i>In the <b>elevator</b> she pressed the button for the lobby.</i>
<b>escalator</b>	A moving staircase consisting of an endlessly circulating belt of steps driven by a motor, which conveys people between the floors of a public building.
<b>high</b>	A high power setting. <i>If the stable is doing well then everybody s on a <b>high</b>.</i>
<a href="#"><b>hoist</b></a>	Move from one place to another by lifting. <i><b>Hoist</b> the flags.</i>
<b>ladder</b>	With reference to tights or stockings develop or cause to develop a ladder. <i>The first time I put them on one of the stockings <b>laddered</b>.</i>

<b>lift</b>	An act of lifting. <i>The Puma tactical transport helicopter has a total <b>lift</b> of up to 5 500 lb.</i>
<b>mounting</b>	The action of mounting something. <i>The <b>mounting</b> of rapid fire guns.</i>
<b>precipitate</b>	A substance precipitated from a solution. <i>Our economy <b>precipitated</b> into complete ruin.</i>
<b>promote</b>	Of an additive act as a promoter of a catalyst. <i>I got <b>promoted</b> after many years of hard work.</i>
<b>raise</b>	Raise from a lower to a higher position. <i><b>Raise</b> an army.</i>
<b>rise</b>	Rise up. <i>The bird has a display flight of steep flapping <b>rises</b>.</i>
<b>risen</b>	(of e.g. celestial bodies) above the horizon. <i>The <b>risen</b> sun.</i>
<b>rising</b>	(of a bird) depicted with the wings open but not fully displayed, as if preparing for flight. <i>The reforms led to peasant <b>risings</b>.</i>
<b>soar</b>	The act of rising upward into the air. <i>When she heard his voice her spirits <b>soared</b>.</i>
<b>soaring</b>	Of imposing height; especially standing out above others. <i>The <b>soaring</b> spires of the cathedral.</i>
<b>stairs</b>	A flight of stairs or a flight of steps.
<b>stepladder</b>	A folding portable ladder hinged at the top.
<b>uphill</b>	The upward slope of a hill. <i>The journey is slightly <b>uphill</b>.</i>
<b>upstairs</b>	The part of a building above the ground floor. <i>She was cleaning the <b>upstairs</b>.</i>
<b>upward</b>	To a later time. <i>The fragments flew <b>upwards</b>.</i>
<b>vertically</b>	In a vertical direction. <i><b>Vertically</b> integrated companies.</i>
<b>zoom</b>	Cause a lens or camera to zoom in or out. <i>The camera <b>zoomed</b> in for a close up of his face.</i>
