ascend	Go up or climb. <i>The Prophet ascended to heaven.</i>
ascending	Moving or going or growing upward. <i>The ascending stems of chickweed.</i>
ascent	A climb or walk to the summit of a mountain or hill. <i>The ascent grew steeper.</i>
boost	Give a boost to be beneficial to. <i>He d had his wallet boosted in a bar.</i>
<u>climb</u>	A mountain hill or slope that is climbed. <i>The rate of climb can be set by the pilot.</i>
<u>climbing</u>	The sport or activity of climbing mountains or cliffs. <i>His other great interest was climbing especially in the Alps.</i>
downstairs	Situated downstairs. <i>I tripped over the cat and fell downstairs.</i>
<u>elevate</u>	Raise to a more important or impressive level. <i>The field guns were elevated twenty degrees.</i>
elevator	The airfoil on the tailplane of an aircraft that makes it ascend or descend. <i>In the elevator she pressed the button for the lobby.</i>
escalator	A moving staircase consisting of an endlessly circulating belt of steps driven by a motor, which conveys people between the floors of a public building.
high	A high power setting. <i>If the stable is doing well then everybody s on a high.</i>
<u>hoist</u>	Move from one place to another by lifting. <i>Hoist the flags.</i>
ladder	With reference to tights or stockings develop or cause to develop a ladder. <i>The first time I put them on one of the stockings laddered.</i>

lift	An act of lifting. <i>The Puma tactical transport helicopter has a total lift of up to 5 500 lb.</i>
mounting	The action of mounting something. <i>The mounting of rapid fire guns.</i>
precipitate	A substance precipitated from a solution. <i>Our economy precipitated into complete ruin.</i>
promote	Of an additive act as a promoter of a catalyst. <i>I got promoted after many years of hard work.</i>
raise	Raise from a lower to a higher position. <i>Raise an army.</i>
rise	Rise up. <i>The bird has a display flight of steep flapping rises.</i>
risen	(of e.g. celestial bodies) above the horizon. <i>The risen sun.</i>
rising	(of a bird) depicted with the wings open but not fully displayed, as if preparing for flight. <i>The reforms led to peasant risings.</i>
soar	The act of rising upward into the air. <i>When she heard his voice her spirits soared.</i>
soaring	Of imposing height; especially standing out above others. <i>The soaring spires of the cathedral.</i>
stairs	A flight of stairs or a flight of steps.
stepladder	A folding portable ladder hinged at the top.
uphill	The upward slope of a hill. <i>The journey is slightly uphill.</i>
upstairs	The part of a building above the ground floor. <i>She was cleaning the upstairs.</i>
upward	To a later time. <i>The fragments flew upwards.</i>
vertically	In a vertical direction. <i>Vertically integrated companies.</i>
zoom	Cause a lens or camera to zoom in or out. <i>The camera zoomed in for a close up of his face.</i>
