<b>appetizing</b>	Stimulating one’s appetite. <i>The <b>appetizing</b> aroma of sizzling bacon.</i>
<b>bewitching</b>	Capturing interest as if by a spell. <i><b>Bewitching</b> smile.</i>

<b>captivating</b>	Capturing interest as if by a spell. <i>A <b>captivating</b> smile.</i>
<b><u>charming</u></b>	Possessing or using or characteristic of or appropriate to supernatural powers. <i>He was a <b>charming</b> affectionate colleague.</i>
<b>choice</b>	(of words or language) rude and abusive. <i>He picked some <b>choice</b> early plums.</i>
<b><u>dainty</u></b>	Affectedly dainty or refined. <i>A <b>dainty</b> morsel.</i>
<b><u>dazzling</u></b>	Extremely bright, especially so as to blind the eyes temporarily. <i>A <b>dazzling</b> smile.</i>
<b><u>delectable</u></b>	Capable of arousing sexual desire. <i>The <b>delectable</b> Ms Davis.</i>
<b>delicious</b>	Extremely pleasing to the sense of taste. <i><b>Delicious</b> home baked brown bread.</i>
<b><u>delightful</u></b>	Greatly pleasing or entertaining. <i>A <b>delightful</b> surprise.</i>
<b><u>enchancing</u></b>	Delightfully charming or attractive. <i><b>Enchancing</b> music.</i>
<b><u>entrancing</u></b>	Capable of attracting and holding interest; charming. <i>Antique papers of <b>entrancing</b> design.</i>
<b><u>exquisite</u></b>	Extremely beautiful and delicate. <i>Her <b>exquisite</b> taste in painting.</i>
<b>flavourful</b>	(of food or drink) having a full, distinctive taste; full of flavour. <i>A higher temperature results in a darker more <b>flavourful</b> beer.</i>
<b>flavoursome</b>	(of food or drink) having a pleasant, distinct flavour; tasty. <i>An incredibly rich and <b>flavoursome</b> dish.</i>
<b>good</b>	Agreeable or pleasing. <i>A <b>good</b> check.</i>
<b>gorgeous</b>	Beautiful; very attractive. <i>The weather was <b>gorgeous</b>.</i>
<b><u>inviting</u></b>	Offering the promise of an attractive or enjoyable experience. <i>An <b>inviting</b> offer.</i>
<b>lovely</b>	Very pleasant or enjoyable; delightful. <i>How <b>lovely</b> to see you.</i>

<b>luscious</b>	(of food or drink) having a pleasingly rich, sweet taste. <i>The <b>luscious</b> brush strokes and warm colours of these late masterpieces.</i>
<b>magnificent</b>	Characterized by grandeur. <i>She paid tribute to their <b>magnificent</b> efforts.</i>
<b>mouth-watering</b>	Pleasing to the sense of taste.
<b>palatable</b>	(of food or drink) pleasant to taste. <i>A very <b>palatable</b> local red wine.</i>
<b>piquant</b>	Having a pleasantly sharp taste or appetizing flavour. <i>A <b>piquant</b> tartare sauce.</i>
<b>pleasant-tasting</b>	Extremely pleasing to the sense of taste.
<b>radiant</b>	Of an appliance designed to emit radiant energy especially for cooking or heating. <i>A bird with <b>radiant</b> green and red plumage.</i>
<b>rich</b>	Marked by richness and fullness of flavor. <i>A <b>rich</b> tenor voice.</i>
<b>savoury</b>	Pleasing to the sense of taste. <i>Fresh pineapple is useful in <b>savoury</b> as well as in sweet dishes.</i>
<b>stunning</b>	Causing great astonishment and consternation. <i>A <b>stunning</b> performance.</i>
<b>succulent</b>	Tender and full of juice. <i>The ever increasing popularity of <b>succulent</b> plants.</i>
<b>sweet</b>	With sweetening added. <i>She seemed quite <b>sweet</b> on him.</i>
<b>tasty</b>	Very attractive or appealing. <i>A <b>tasty</b> deal at the building society.</i>
<b>toothsome</b>	Extremely pleasing to the sense of taste. <i>A <b>toothsome</b> morsel.</i>
<b>wonderful</b>	Extraordinarily good or great ; used especially as intensifiers. <i>They all think she s <b>wonderful</b>.</i>
<b>yummy</b>	Extremely pleasing to the sense of taste. <i>Who s that <b>yummy</b> guy with the black hair.</i>
