bewitching	Capturing interest as if by a spell. <i>Bewitching smile.</i>

captivating	Capturing interest as if by a spell. <i>A captivating smile.</i>
<u>charming</u>	Possessing or using or characteristic of or appropriate to supernatural powers. <i>He was a charming affectionate colleague.</i>
choice	(of words or language) rude and abusive. <i>He picked some choice early plums.</i>
<u>dainty</u>	Affectedly dainty or refined. <i>A dainty morsel.</i>
<u>dazzling</u>	Extremely bright, especially so as to blind the eyes temporarily. <i>A dazzling smile.</i>
<u>delectable</u>	Capable of arousing sexual desire. <i>The delectable Ms Davis.</i>
delicious	Extremely pleasing to the sense of taste. <i>Delicious home baked brown bread.</i>
<u>delightful</u>	Greatly pleasing or entertaining. <i>A delightful surprise.</i>
<u>enchancing</u>	Delightfully charming or attractive. <i>Enchanting music.</i>
<u>entrancing</u>	Capable of attracting and holding interest; charming. <i>Antique papers of entrancing design.</i>
<u>exquisite</u>	Extremely beautiful and delicate. <i>Her exquisite taste in painting.</i>
flavourful	(of food or drink) having a full, distinctive taste; full of flavour. <i>A higher temperature results in a darker more flavourful beer.</i>
flavoursome	(of food or drink) having a pleasant, distinct flavour; tasty. <i>An incredibly rich and flavoursome dish.</i>
good	Agreeable or pleasing. <i>A good check.</i>
gorgeous	Beautiful; very attractive. <i>The weather was gorgeous.</i>
<u>inviting</u>	Offering the promise of an attractive or enjoyable experience. <i>An inviting offer.</i>
lovely	Very pleasant or enjoyable; delightful. <i>How lovely to see you.</i>

<u>luscious</u>	(of food or drink) having a pleasingly rich, sweet taste. <i>The luscious brush strokes and warm colours of these late masterpieces.</i>
magnificent	Characterized by grandeur. <i>She paid tribute to their magnificent efforts.</i>
mouth-watering	Pleasing to the sense of taste.
<u>palatable</u>	(of food or drink) pleasant to taste. <i>A very palatable local red wine.</i>
piquant	Having a pleasantly sharp taste or appetizing flavour. <i>A piquant tartare sauce.</i>
pleasant-tasting	Extremely pleasing to the sense of taste.
radiant	Of an appliance designed to emit radiant energy especially for cooking or heating. <i>A bird with radiant green and red plumage.</i>
rich	Marked by richness and fullness of flavor. <i>A rich tenor voice.</i>
savoury	Pleasing to the sense of taste. <i>Fresh pineapple is useful in savoury as well as in sweet dishes.</i>
stunning	Causing great astonishment and consternation. <i>A stunning performance.</i>
<u>succulent</u>	Tender and full of juice. <i>The ever increasing popularity of succulent plants.</i>
<u>sweet</u>	With sweetening added. <i>She seemed quite sweet on him.</i>
<u>tasty</u>	Very attractive or appealing. <i>A tasty deal at the building society.</i>
toothsome	Extremely pleasing to the sense of taste. <i>A toothsome morsel.</i>
wonderful	Extraordinarily good or great ; used especially as intensifiers. <i>They all think she s wonderful.</i>
<u>yummy</u>	Extremely pleasing to the sense of taste. <i>Who s that yummy guy with the black hair.</i>
