captivating	Capturing interest as if by a spell. A <b>captivating</b> smile.
<u>charming</u>	Possessing or using or characteristic of or appropriate to supernatural powers. <i>He was a <b>charming</b> affectionate colleague.</i>
choice	(of words or language) rude and abusive. He picked some <b>choice</b> early plums.
<u>dainty</u>	Affectedly dainty or refined. A <b>dainty</b> morsel.
<u>dazzling</u>	Extremely bright, especially so as to blind the eyes temporarily. <i>A <b>dazzling</b> smile.</i>
<u>delectable</u>	Capable of arousing sexual desire. The <b>delectable</b> Ms Davis.
delicious	Extremely pleasing to the sense of taste. <b>Delicious</b> home baked brown bread.
<u>delightful</u>	Greatly pleasing or entertaining. A <b>delightful</b> surprise.
<u>enchanting</u>	Delightfully charming or attractive. <i>Enchanting music</i> .
<u>entrancing</u>	Capable of attracting and holding interest; charming. Antique papers of <b>entrancing</b> design.
<u>exquisite</u>	Extremely beautiful and delicate. <i>Her <b>exquisite</b> taste in painting.</i>
flavourful	(of food or drink) having a full, distinctive taste; full of flavour. A higher temperature results in a darker more <b>flavourful</b> beer.
flavoursome	(of food or drink) having a pleasant, distinct flavour; tasty. An incredibly rich and <b>flavoursome</b> dish.
good	Agreeable or pleasing. A <b>good</b> check.
gorgeous	Beautiful; very attractive. The weather was <b>gorgeous</b> .
<u>inviting</u>	Offering the promise of an attractive or enjoyable experience. <i>An <b>inviting</b> offer.</i>
lovely	Very pleasant or enjoyable; delightful. <i>How <b>lovely</b> to see you.</i>



<u>luscious</u>	(of food or drink) having a pleasingly rich, sweet taste. The <b>luscious</b> brush strokes and warm colours of these late masterpieces.
magnificent	Characterized by grandeur. She paid tribute to their <b>magnificent</b> efforts.
mouth-watering	Pleasing to the sense of taste.
<u>palatable</u>	(of food or drink) pleasant to taste. A very <b>palatable</b> local red wine.
piquant	Having a pleasantly sharp taste or appetizing flavour. A <b>piquant</b> tartare sauce.
pleasant-tasting	Extremely pleasing to the sense of taste.
radiant	Of an appliance designed to emit radiant energy especially for cooking or heating. <i>A bird with <b>radiant</b> green and red plumage.</i>
rich	Marked by richness and fullness of flavor. A <b>rich</b> tenor voice.
savoury	Pleasing to the sense of taste. Fresh pineapple is useful in <b>savoury</b> as well as in sweet dishes.
stunning	Causing great astonishment and consternation. A <b>stunning</b> performance.
<u>succulent</u>	Tender and full of juice. The ever increasing popularity of <b>succulent</b> plants.
<u>sweet</u>	With sweetening added. She seemed quite <b>sweet</b> on him.
<u>tasty</u>	Very attractive or appealing. A <b>tasty</b> deal at the building society.
toothsome	Extremely pleasing to the sense of taste. A <b>toothsome</b> morsel.
wonderful	Extraordinarily good or great ; used especially as intensifiers. <i>They all think she s <b>wonderful</b></i> .
<u>yummy</u>	Extremely pleasing to the sense of taste. Who s that <b>yummy</b> guy with the black hair.
