Synonyms of "Scrutinize" as a verb (11 Words)

<u>audit</u>	Conduct a systematic review of. <i>He made use of the knowledge gleaned from economics classes he</i> <i>audit</i> ed.
examine carefully	Observe, check out, and look over carefully or inspect.
inspect	Look at (someone or something) closely, typically to assess their condition or to discover any shortcomings. They inspect ed the paintwork for cracks and flaws.
look over	Give a certain impression or have a certain outward aspect.
peruse	Examine carefully or at length. I peruse d several online reviews.
<u>scan</u>	Move a light beam over; in electronics, to reproduce an image. <i>The surgeon</i> scan <i>ned the X ray.</i>
scrutinise	To look at critically or searchingly, or in minute detail.



size up	Sort according to size.
study	Be a student follow a course of study be enrolled at an institute of learning. <i>He has been studying mink for many years.</i>
<u>survey</u>	Make a survey of for statistical purposes. I survey ed the options.
take stock	Develop a habit.

inspect	Look over carefully. Please inspect your father s will carefully.
inspector	A police officer ranking below a chief inspector. A prison inspector .
investigate	Investigate scientifically. Let s investigate the syntax of Chinese.
investigation	The work of inquiring into something thoroughly and systematically. An investigation into fresh allegations of malpractice.
lab	A laboratory. A science lab .
microscope	Magnifier of the image of small objects. The invention of the microscope led to the discovery of the cell.
monitor	Display produced by a device that takes signals and displays them on a television screen or a computer monitor. It was not easy to discover exactly how many calls were monitor ed.
observational	Relating to the action or process of closely observing or watching something or someone. <i>Our study was purely observational.</i>
<u>oversee</u>	Supervise (a person or their work), especially in an official capacity. <i>The Home Secretary</i> oversee s the police service.
probe	Examine physically with or as if with a probe. There was a congressional probe into the scandal.
pry	To move or force, especially in an effort to get something open. Raccoons managed to pry the lid off the garbage pail.
reconnoiter	Explore, often with the goal of finding something or somebody.



<u>scan</u>	An image produced by scanning. Text and pictures can be scan ned into the computer.
scrutiny	Critical observation or examination. Every aspect of local government was placed under scrutiny .
seek	Try to get or reach. She always seek s to do good in the world.
<u>supervise</u>	Keep tabs on; keep an eye on; keep under surveillance. The sergeant left to supervise the loading of the lorries.
surveillance	Close observation, especially of a suspected spy or criminal. <i>He found himself put under surveillance by British military intelligence.</i>
<u>survey</u>	A department carrying out the surveying of land. The third type of report is a full structural survey .
test	Produce a specified result in a medical test especially a drugs test or AIDS test. He test ed positive for steroids during the race.
