
Sculpture as a Verb

- Make or represent (a form) by carving, casting, or other shaping techniques.
- $\bullet \ Form \ or \ shape \ as \ if \ by \ sculpture, \ especially \ with \ strong, \ smooth \ curves.$
- ullet Shape (a material like stone or wood) by whittling away at it.
- Create by shaping stone or wood or any other hard material.


