model A simplified description, especially a mathematical one, of a system or process to assist calculations and predictions.

*Strikes have dogged the production of the **models**.*

statue A sculpture representing a human or animal.

statuette A small statue or figurine, especially one that is smaller than life-size.

- *Form or shape as if by sculpture, especially with strong, smooth curves.*
- *Shape (a material like stone or wood) by whittling away at it.*
- *Create by shaping stone or wood or any other hard material.*



Synonyms of "Sculpture" as a verb (11 Words)

- carve** Produce (an object, inscription, or design) by cutting into a hard material.
*He **carved** himself a slice of beef.*
- cast** Form by pouring e.g. wax or hot metal into a cast or mold.
*He **cast** the book down on to the chair angrily.*
- chisel** Cut or shape something with a chisel.
***Chisel** the marble.*
- cut** Form or shape by cutting or incising.
***Cut** my hair.*
- fashion** Make into a particular form.
*The skins were **fashioned** into boots and shoes.*
- form** Make or be made into a specific shape or form.
*His features **formed** into a smile of pleasure.*
- grave** Shape (a material like stone or wood) by whittling away at it.

- hew** Make or shape as with an axe.

- model** Work as a model by displaying clothes or posing for an artist or sculptor.
*A computer program that can **model** the behaviour of smoke.*
- sculpt** Create or represent (something) by carving, casting, or other shaping techniques.
***Sculpt** a swan out of a block of ice.*
- shape** Shape or influence give direction to.
*I had plenty of time and **shaped** to kick to the near touchline.*

- *Marine invasions have played a prominent part in sculpturing Canada's scenery.*
- *The choir stalls were each carefully sculptured.*

engrave	Cut or carve a text or design on (a hard object). <i>The crystal glasses were engraved with the Queen s cipher.</i>
etch	Make an etching of. <i>Semiconductor production processes such as plasma etch.</i>
forwarding	The act of sending on to another destination. <i>The forwarding of mail to a new address is done automatically.</i>
furtherance	The advancement of a scheme or interest. <i>The court held that the union s acts were not in furtherance of a trade dispute.</i>
granite	Something having the quality of granite unyielding firmness. <i>Granite columns.</i>
gypsum	A common white or colorless mineral (hydrated calcium sulphate) used to make cements and plasters (especially plaster of Paris).
incise	Cut (skin or flesh) with a surgical instrument. <i>Figures incised on upright stones.</i>
landmark	An event or discovery marking an important stage or turning point in something. <i>The church steeple provided a convenient landmark.</i>
limestone	A sedimentary rock consisting mainly of calcium that was deposited by the remains of marine animals.
marble	Paint or stain like marble. <i>The stone walls were marbled with moss and lichen.</i>
memorial	A statement of facts, especially as the basis of a petition. <i>A memorial service in the dead man s honour.</i>
monument	A structure erected to commemorate persons or events. <i>The amphitheatre is one of the many Greek monuments in Sicily.</i>
monumental	Of or serving as a monument. <i>Additional details are found in monumental inscriptions.</i>
porphyry	A hard igneous rock containing crystals of feldspar in a fine-grained groundmass.
quartz	A hard glossy mineral consisting of silicon dioxide in crystal form present in most rocks especially sandstone and granite yellow sand is quartz with iron oxide impurities.
rock	A mass of rock projecting above the earth s surface or out of the sea. <i>There are dangerous rocks around the island.</i>
sculpt	Shape (a material like stone or wood) by whittling away at it. <i>She was teaching him how to sculpt.</i>

seascape	A depiction of a seascape.
statuary	Statues collectively. <i>Classical statuary.</i>
statue	A sculpture representing a human or animal.
statuesque	Of size and dignity suggestive of a statue. <i>Her statuesque beauty.</i>
stone	Remove the stone from a fruit. <i>High stone walls.</i>
totem	A clan or tribe identified by their kinship to a common totemic object. <i>The fast food chains have become totems of Western economic development.</i>
