### **Definitions of "Seasoned" as an adjective**

- *Accustomed to particular conditions; experienced.*
- *(of food) having had salt, pepper, herbs, or spices added.*
- *(of wood) made suitable for use as timber by adjusting its moisture content.*
- *Rendered competent through trial and experience.*
- *Aged or processed.*

- accomplished** Highly skilled.  
*A very elegant and **accomplished** person.*
- adept** Having or showing knowledge and skill and aptitude.  
*He is an **adept** at imitation.*
- adroit** Quick or skillful or adept in action or thought.  
*An **adroit** negotiator.*
- artisan** (of food or drink) made in a traditional or non-mechanized way using high-quality ingredients.  
*The growing appreciation of **artisan** foods.*
- capable** Able to achieve efficiently whatever one has to do; competent.  
***Capable** of winning.*

<b>competence</b>	The quality of being adequately or well qualified physically and intellectually. <i>The players displayed varying degrees of <b>competence</b>.</i>
<b>competent</b>	Capable of performing the normal function effectively. <i>The London Stock Exchange is the <b>competent</b> authority under the Financial Services Act.</i>
<b>craftsman</b>	A creator of great skill in the manual arts. <i>As an actor he was a consummate <b>craftsman</b>.</i>
<b>experience</b>	Undergo or live through a difficult experience. <i><b>Experience</b> vertigo.</i>
<b>experienced</b>	Having gained knowledge or skill in a particular field over time. <i>She was <b>experienced</b> in marketing.</i>
<b>fluency</b>	Powerful and effective language. <i><b>Fluency</b> in Spanish is essential.</i>
<b>fluently</b>	In a smoothly graceful and effortless manner. <i>He writes <b>fluently</b> and authoritatively.</i>
<b>knowledgeable</b>	Highly educated; having extensive information or understanding. <i>Surprisingly <b>knowledgeable</b> about what was going on.</i>
<b>learned</b>	(of a person) having acquired much knowledge through study. <i>An article in a <b>learned</b> journal.</i>
<b>mason</b>	A Freemason. <i>One course of massive stones roughly <b>masoned</b>.</i>
<b>masterful</b>	Performed or performing very skilfully. <i><b>Masterful</b> technique.</i>
<b>practiced</b>	Having or showing knowledge and skill and aptitude. <i>A <b>practiced</b> marksman.</i>
<b>professionally</b>	In a manner worthy of or appropriate to a professional person; skilfully. <i>The situation was handled <b>professionally</b>.</i>
<b>proficiency</b>	The quality of having great facility and competence. <i>Practice greatly improves <b>proficiency</b>.</i>
<b>proficient</b>	A person who is proficient. <i>I was <b>proficient</b> at my job.</i>
<b>repairman</b>	A person who repairs vehicles, machinery, or appliances. <i>A TV <b>repairman</b>.</i>
<b>skilled</b>	Based on or proceeding from the ability to do something well. <i>A lab technician <b>skilled</b> in electronics.</i>

<b>skillful</b>	Having or showing knowledge and skill and aptitude. <i>A lesser known but no less <b>skillful</b> composer.</i>
<b>suitably</b>	In an appropriate manner. <i>The judges were <b>suitably</b> impressed.</i>
<b><u>technical</u></b>	Resulting from or dependent on market factors rather than fundamental economic considerations. <i>The fall is only a <b>technical</b> correction.</i>
<b>technician</b>	A person skilled in the technique of an art or craft. <i>A laboratory <b>technician</b>.</i>
<b>toolmaker</b>	A maker of tools, especially a person who makes and maintains tools for use in a manufacturing process.
<b><u>veteran</u></b>	A person who has had long experience in a particular field. <i><b>Veteran</b> steadiness.</i>
<b>virtuoso</b>	A person with a special knowledge of or interest in works of art or curios. <i>A <b>virtuoso</b> performance.</i>
<b><u>workforce</u></b>	The people engaged in or available for work, either in a country or area or in a particular firm or industry. <i>A quarter of Galway s manufacturing <b>workforce</b> are being put out of a job.</i>
