- *Accustomed to particular conditions; experienced.*
- *(of food) having had salt, pepper, herbs, or spices added.*
- *(of wood) made suitable for use as timber by adjusting its moisture content.*
- *Rendered competent through trial and experience.*
- *Aged or processed.*

- accomplished** Highly skilled.
*A very elegant and **accomplished** person.*
- adept** Having or showing knowledge and skill and aptitude.
*He is an **adept** at imitation.*
- adroit** Quick or skillful or adept in action or thought.
*An **adroit** negotiator.*
- artisan** (of food or drink) made in a traditional or non-mechanized way using high-quality ingredients.
*The growing appreciation of **artisan** foods.*
- capable** Able to achieve efficiently whatever one has to do; competent.
***Capable** of winning.*

competence	The quality of being adequately or well qualified physically and intellectually. <i>The players displayed varying degrees of competence.</i>
competent	Capable of performing the normal function effectively. <i>The London Stock Exchange is the competent authority under the Financial Services Act.</i>
<u>craftsman</u>	A creator of great skill in the manual arts. <i>As an actor he was a consummate craftsman.</i>
experience	Undergo or live through a difficult experience. <i>Experience vertigo.</i>
experienced	Having gained knowledge or skill in a particular field over time. <i>She was experienced in marketing.</i>
fluency	Powerful and effective language. <i>Fluency in Spanish is essential.</i>
fluently	In a smoothly graceful and effortless manner. <i>He writes fluently and authoritatively.</i>
knowledgeable	Highly educated; having extensive information or understanding. <i>Surprisingly knowledgeable about what was going on.</i>
learned	(of a person) having acquired much knowledge through study. <i>An article in a learned journal.</i>
mason	A Freemason. <i>One course of massive stones roughly masoned.</i>
<u>masterful</u>	Performed or performing very skilfully. <i>Masterful technique.</i>
practiced	Having or showing knowledge and skill and aptitude. <i>A practiced marksman.</i>
professionally	In a manner worthy of or appropriate to a professional person; skilfully. <i>The situation was handled professionally.</i>
proficiency	The quality of having great facility and competence. <i>Practice greatly improves proficiency.</i>
proficient	A person who is proficient. <i>I was proficient at my job.</i>
repairman	A person who repairs vehicles, machinery, or appliances. <i>A TV repairman.</i>
skilled	Based on or proceeding from the ability to do something well. <i>A lab technician skilled in electronics.</i>

skillful	Having or showing knowledge and skill and aptitude. <i>A lesser known but no less skillful composer.</i>
suitably	In an appropriate manner. <i>The judges were suitably impressed.</i>
<u>technical</u>	Resulting from or dependent on market factors rather than fundamental economic considerations. <i>The fall is only a technical correction.</i>
technician	A person skilled in the technique of an art or craft. <i>A laboratory technician.</i>
toolmaker	A maker of tools, especially a person who makes and maintains tools for use in a manufacturing process.
<u>veteran</u>	A person who has had long experience in a particular field. <i>Veteran steadiness.</i>
virtuoso	A person with a special knowledge of or interest in works of art or curios. <i>A virtuoso performance.</i>
<u>workforce</u>	The people engaged in or available for work, either in a country or area or in a particular firm or industry. <i>A quarter of Galway s manufacturing workforce are being put out of a job.</i>
