### Definitions of "Secluded" as an adjective

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “secluded” as an adjective can have the following definitions:

- *Hidden from general view or use.*
- *(of a place) not seen or visited by many people; sheltered and private.*
- *Providing privacy or seclusion.*



## Synonyms of "Secluded" as an adjective (11 Words)

<b>cloistered</b>	Kept away from the outside world; sheltered. <i>The <b>cloistered</b> academic world of books.</i>
<b>concealed</b>	Not accessible to view. <i>A <b>concealed</b> compartment in his briefcase.</i>
<b><u>hidden</u></b>	Designed to elude detection. <i><b>Hidden</b> dangers.</i>
<b><u>private</u></b>	Concerning things deeply private and personal. <i><b>Private</b> family matters.</i>
<b>privity</b>	Informed about something secret or not generally known. <i><b>Privity</b> to the details of the conspiracy.</i>
<b><u>reclusive</u></b>	Providing privacy or seclusion. <i>Sitting under the <b>reclusive</b> calm of a shade tree.</i>
<b>secret</b>	Of information given in confidence or in secret. <i><b>Secret</b> or private thoughts.</i>



**sequestered** Providing privacy or seclusion.  
*A wild **sequestered** spot.*

**sheltered** Protected from difficulties or unpleasant realities.  
*I was a mathematics don at Cambridge living a rather **sheltered** life.*

**undisturbed** Untroubled by interference or disturbance.  
*The tombs had lain **undisturbed** for 2 500 years.*

**unfrequented** Devoid of creatures.  
*A region with only a few **unfrequented** tracks.*



## Usage Examples of "Secluded" as an adjective

- *The gardens are quiet and secluded.*
- *A secluded romantic spot.*





## Associations of "Secluded" (30 Words)

<b><u>alienate</u></b>	Make (someone) feel isolated or estranged. <i>An urban environment which would <b>alienate</b> its inhabitants.</i>
<b>alone</b>	Radically distinctive and without equal. <i>This theory is altogether <b>alone</b> in its penetration of the problem.</i>
<b>cloistered</b>	Of communal life sequestered from the world under religious vows. <i>The <b>cloistered</b> academic world of books.</i>
<b>detached</b>	(of a house or other building) not joined to another on either side. <i>She felt <b>detached</b> from the group.</i>
<b>estrangle</b>	Remove from customary environment or associations. <i>Years of boarding school <b>estranged</b> the child from her home.</i>
<b><u>forlorn</u></b>	(of an aim or endeavour) unlikely to succeed or be fulfilled. <i>A <b>forlorn</b> attempt to escape.</i>
<b><u>hermit</u></b>	A hummingbird found in the shady lower layers of tropical forests, foraging along a regular route.
<b>isolate</b>	A culture of microorganisms isolated for study. <i>A country which is <b>isolated</b> from the rest of the world.</i>

<b>isolated</b>	Remote and separate physically or socially. <i>Tiny <b>isolated</b> villages remote from centers of civilization.</i>
<b>isolation</b>	A country's withdrawal from international politics. <i>He opposed a policy of American <b>isolation</b>.</i>
<b>lone</b>	(of a parent) not having a partner to share the care of one's child or children. <i>I am by no means a <b>lone</b> voice.</i>
<b>loneliness</b>	The state of being alone in solitary isolation. <i>The <b>loneliness</b> of a sailor's life.</i>
<b>lonely</b>	Devoid of creatures. <i>A <b>lonely</b> crossroads.</i>
<b>lonesome</b>	Marked by dejection from being alone. <i>A <b>lonesome</b> pine.</i>
<b>privacy</b>	The condition of being concealed or hidden. <i>A law to restrict newspapers freedom to invade people's <b>privacy</b>.</i>
<b>recluse</b>	One who lives in solitude. <i>He's a bit of a <b>recluse</b>.</i>
<b>reclusive</b>	Avoiding the company of other people; solitary. <i>Sitting under the <b>reclusive</b> calm of a shade tree.</i>
<b>remote</b>	A remote control device. <i>The <b>remote</b> past or future.</i>
<b>seclude</b>	Keep (someone) away from other people. <i>I <b>secluded</b> myself up here for a life of study and meditation.</i>
<b>seclusion</b>	The quality of being secluded from the presence or view of others. <i>They enjoyed ten days of peace and <b>seclusion</b>.</i>
<b>segregate</b>	Someone who is or has been segregated. <i>Black people were <b>segregated</b> in churches schools and colleges.</i>
<b>separate</b>	Become separated into pieces or fragments. <i>Police were trying to <b>separate</b> two rioting mobs.</i>
<b>sequester</b>	A general cut in government spending. <i>The dentist <b>sequesters</b> the tooth he is working on.</i>
<b>sole</b>	Put a new sole on. <i>The <b>sole</b> example.</i>
<b>solitary</b>	(of a flower or other part) borne singly. <i>A <b>solitary</b> walk.</i>
<b>solitude</b>	The state or situation of being alone. <i>The battle to preserve beloved <b>solitudes</b> flared up all over the country.</i>



**troglodyte** (especially in prehistoric times) a person who lived in a cave.

**underpopulated** Having a lower population density than normal or desirable.  
*The richly endowed but **underpopulated** Ivory Coast.*

**unrewarding** Not rewarding or satisfying.  
*It was dull **unrewarding** work.*

**withdrawn** Withdrawn from society seeking solitude.  
*When her husband died she became very **withdrawn**.*
