- An official in charge of a US government department.
- An assistant who handles correspondence and clerical work for a boss or an organization.
- A person to whom a secret is entrusted.
- A person employed by an individual or in an office to assist with correspondence, make appointments, and carry out administrative tasks.
- The principal assistant of a UK government minister or ambassador.
- A desk used for writing.
- A person who is head of an administrative department of government.
- An official of a society or other organization who conducts its correspondence and keeps its records.

- She was secretary to David Wilby MP.
- She was secretary of the Women's Labour League.





Associations of "Secretary" (30 Words)

accountant A person whose job is to keep, inspect, and analyse financial accounts.

A statement of recent transactions and the resulting balance.

An investigation into suspected false **accounting**.

acolyteA person assisting a priest in a religious service or procession.

She runs the department through a small group of **acolytes**.

adjutant

A military officer who acts as an administrative assistant to a senior officer.

He eventually became **adjutant** to the commander of the tactical air force.

aide-de-camp Providing sophisticated amusement by virtue of having artificially (and

vulgarly) mannered or banal or sentimental qualities.

allegiant That owes or gives allegiance (to someone or something); loyal, faithful.

It is impossible to be **allegiant** to two opposing forces.

auditor A listener.

The company is required to appoint **auditor**s at each general meeting.



bookkeeper A person whose job is to keep records of the financial affairs of a business.

The business had grown enough to justify hiring a **bookkeeper**.

butler English novelist who described a fictitious land he called Erewhon

(1835-1902.

A person handling payments and receipts in a shop, bank, or business.

Cashier the literal sense of this word.

A device for cleaning such as a vacuum cleaner.

She s one of the office **cleaner**s.

clerk Work as a clerk as in the legal business.

A **clerk** to the magistrates.

dutiful Conscientiously or obediently fulfilling one's duty.

Dutiful applause.

enslave Make (someone) a slave.

They were **enslave**d by their need to take drugs.

The account at the Bank of England in which is held the Consolidated Fund,

exchequer into which tax receipts and other public monies are paid.

An important source of revenue to the sultan s **exchequer**.

A servant employed to do a variety of jobs.

He was employed as the general **factotum**.

footman A soldier in the infantry.

housekeeper A person employed to manage a household.

A person who tries to please someone in order to gain a personal

lackey advantage.

He denied that he was the **lackey** of the Chief Secretary to the Treasury.

A female domestic.

maid

Mary eventually managed to find a job as a maid.

minion A servile or fawning dependant.

He gets oppressed **minion**s like me to fob them off.

A person employed to carry luggage and supplies.

A nice pint of **porter**.

receptionist A person employed in a hotel to receive guests and deal with their

bookings.

A person who performs duties for others, especially a person employed in a

servant house on domestic duties or as a personal attendant.

A government **servant**.



solicitor

A member of the legal profession qualified to deal with conveyancing the

drawing up of wills and other legal matters A solicitor may also instruct

barristers and represent clients in some courts.

She had been a telephone **solicitor** for a Chicago newspaper.

An official appointed to supervise arrangements or keep order at a large

steward public event, for example a race, match, or demonstration.

The event was organized and **steward**ed properly.

surveyor A person who examines the condition of land and buildings professionally.

Surveyors recorded the species and locations of fallen trees.

teller Someone who tells a story.

The growing use of automatic **teller**s.

<u>treasurer</u> An officer charged with receiving and disbursing funds.

waiter A person who waits for a time, event, or opportunity.
