### Definitions of "Secretary" as a noun

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “secretary” as a noun can have the following definitions:

- *An official in charge of a US government department.*
- *An assistant who handles correspondence and clerical work for a boss or an organization.*
- *A person to whom a secret is entrusted.*
- *A person employed by an individual or in an office to assist with correspondence, make appointments, and carry out administrative tasks.*
- *The principal assistant of a UK government minister or ambassador.*
- *A desk used for writing.*
- *A person who is head of an administrative department of government.*
- *An official of a society or other organization who conducts its correspondence and keeps its records.*



## Synonyms of "Secretary" as a noun (12 Words)

<b>administrator</b>	A person who dispenses or administers something. <i>Administrators of justice.</i>
<b>amanuensis</b>	A literary or artistic assistant, in particular one who takes dictation or copies manuscripts.
<b>assistant</b>	A person who ranks below a senior person. <i>My invaluable <b>assistant</b>.</i>
<b>clerk</b>	A senior official in Parliament. <i>A bank <b>clerk</b>.</i>
<b>escritoire</b>	A desk used for writing.
<b>girl friday</b>	A young woman.
<b>man friday</b>	All of the living human inhabitants of the earth.
<b>pa</b>	Father. <i><b>Pa</b> is busy on the telephone.</i>
<b>personal assistant</b>	A short newspaper article about a particular person or group.
<b>repository</b>	A place where or receptacle in which things are or may be stored. <i>His mind was a rich <b>repository</b> of the past.</i>
<b>secretaire</b>	A small writing desk; an <i>escritoire</i> .
<b>writing table</b>	The work of a writer; anything expressed in letters of the alphabet (especially when considered from the point of view of style and effect).



## Usage Examples of "Secretary" as a noun

- *Chief Secretary to the Treasury.*
- *She was secretary to David Wilby MP.*
- *She was secretary of the Women's Labour League.*



## Associations of "Secretary" (30 Words)

- accountant** A person whose job is to keep, inspect, and analyse financial accounts.
- accounting** A statement of recent transactions and the resulting balance.  
*An investigation into suspected false **accounting**.*
- acolyte** A person assisting a priest in a religious service or procession.  
*She runs the department through a small group of **acolytes**.*
- adjutant** A military officer who acts as an administrative assistant to a senior officer.  
*He eventually became **adjutant** to the commander of the tactical air force.*
- aide-de-camp** Providing sophisticated amusement by virtue of having artificially (and vulgarly) mannered or banal or sentimental qualities.
- allegiant** That owes or gives allegiance (to someone or something); loyal, faithful.  
*It is impossible to be **allegiant** to two opposing forces.*
- auditor** A listener.  
*The company is required to appoint **auditors** at each general meeting.*

<b>bookkeeper</b>	A person whose job is to keep records of the financial affairs of a business. <i>The business had grown enough to justify hiring a <b>bookkeeper</b>.</i>
<b>butler</b>	English novelist who described a fictitious land he called Erewhon (1835-1902).
<u><a href="#">cashier</a></u>	A person handling payments and receipts in a shop, bank, or business. <i><b>Cashier</b> the literal sense of this word.</i>
<u><a href="#">cleaner</a></u>	A device for cleaning such as a vacuum cleaner. <i>She s one of the office <b>cleaners</b>.</i>
<b>clerk</b>	Work as a clerk as in the legal business. <i>A <b>clerk</b> to the magistrates.</i>
<b>dutiful</b>	Conscientiously or obediently fulfilling one's duty. <i><b>Dutiful</b> applause.</i>
<b>enslave</b>	Make (someone) a slave. <i>They were <b>enslaved</b> by their need to take drugs.</i>
<b>exchequer</b>	The account at the Bank of England in which is held the Consolidated Fund, into which tax receipts and other public monies are paid. <i>An important source of revenue to the sultan s <b>exchequer</b>.</i>
<b>factotum</b>	A servant employed to do a variety of jobs. <i>He was employed as the general <b>factotum</b>.</i>
<b>footman</b>	A soldier in the infantry.
<u><a href="#">housekeeper</a></u>	A person employed to manage a household.
<b>lackey</b>	A person who tries to please someone in order to gain a personal advantage. <i>He denied that he was the <b>lackey</b> of the Chief Secretary to the Treasury.</i>
<u><a href="#">maid</a></u>	A female domestic. <i>Mary eventually managed to find a job as a <b>maid</b>.</i>
<u><a href="#">minion</a></u>	A servile or fawning dependant. <i>He gets oppressed <b>minions</b> like me to fob them off.</i>
<b>porter</b>	A person employed to carry luggage and supplies. <i>A nice pint of <b>porter</b>.</i>
<b>receptionist</b>	A person employed in a hotel to receive guests and deal with their bookings.
<u><a href="#">servant</a></u>	A person who performs duties for others, especially a person employed in a house on domestic duties or as a personal attendant. <i>A government <b>servant</b>.</i>

<b>solicitor</b>	A member of the legal profession qualified to deal with conveyancing the drawing up of wills and other legal matters A solicitor may also instruct barristers and represent clients in some courts. <i>She had been a telephone <b>solicitor</b> for a Chicago newspaper.</i>
<b>steward</b>	An official appointed to supervise arrangements or keep order at a large public event, for example a race, match, or demonstration. <i>The event was organized and <b>stewarded</b> properly.</i>
<b>surveyor</b>	A person who examines the condition of land and buildings professionally. <i><b>Surveyors</b> recorded the species and locations of fallen trees.</i>
<b>teller</b>	Someone who tells a story. <i>The growing use of automatic <b>tellers</b>.</i>
<u><a href="#">treasurer</a></u>	An officer charged with receiving and disbursing funds.
<u><a href="#">waiter</a></u>	A person who waits for a time, event, or opportunity.
