## Secrete as a Verb

### Definitions of "Secrete" as a verb

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “secrete” as a verb can have the following definitions:

- *Place out of sight; keep secret.*
- *Generate and separate from cells or bodily fluids.*
- *(of a cell, gland, or organ) produce and discharge (a substance).*



## Synonyms of "Secrete" as a verb (12 Words)

- discharge** Go off or discharge.  
*If the jury cannot agree it should be **discharged**.*
- emanate** Give out (breath or an odor).  
*He **emanated** a powerful brooding air.*
- emit** Give off, send forth, or discharge; as of light, heat, or radiation, vapor, etc.  
*She **emitted** a sound like laughter.*
- excrete** Eliminate from the body.  
*Excess bicarbonate is **excreted** by the kidney.*
- exude** Release (a liquid) in drops or small quantities.  
***Exude** sweat through the pores.*
- give off** Offer in good faith.
- leach** Cause a liquid to leach or percolate.  
*Ash is readily **leached**.*
- leak** Be leaked.  
*The container **leaked** gasoline.*
- ooze** Pass gradually or leak through or as if through small openings.  
*She **oozes** a raunchy sex appeal.*
- produce** Make or manufacture from components or raw materials.  
*We **produce** more cars than we can sell.*
- release** Release as from one's grip.  
***Release** a hormone into the blood stream.*
- send out** To cause or order to be taken, directed, or transmitted to another place.



## Usage Examples of "Secrete" as a verb

- *Insulin is secreted in response to rising levels of glucose in the blood.*
- *The money was secreted from his children.*
- *Secrete digestive juices.*



## Associations of "Secrete" (30 Words)

A skin condition characterized by red pimples on the skin, especially on the face, due to inflamed or infected sebaceous glands and prevalent chiefly among adolescents.

**acne**

*He was clean shaven with a face that had been ravaged by **acne** when younger.*

A bitter greenish-brown alkaline fluid which aids digestion and is secreted by the liver and stored in the gall bladder.

**bile**

*His response was full of **bile** and hatred.*

The local area covered by one of the short range transmitters in a cellular telephone system.

**cell**

*A button **cell** for a quartz watch.*

(of food or medicine) aiding or promoting the process of digestion.

**digestive**

*Tubes of **digestive** mints.*

<b>discharge</b>	Go off or discharge. <i>A police permit for <b>discharge</b> of an air gun.</i>
<b>endocrine</b>	Any of the glands of the endocrine system that secrete hormones directly into the bloodstream. <i><b>Endocrine</b> system.</i>
<b>gland</b>	A structure resembling a gland especially a lymph node. <i>Symptoms include swollen <b>glands</b>.</i>
<b>hormone</b>	A person's sex hormones as held to influence behaviour or mood. <i>She told herself she was suffering from <b>hormones</b> that she would cheer up soon.</i>
<b>liver</b>	Liver of an animal used as meat. <i>A high <b>liver</b>.</i>
<b>mucous</b>	Relating to, producing, covered with, or of the nature of mucus. <i><b>Mucous</b> tissue.</i>
<b>mucus</b>	Protective secretion of the mucus membranes in the gut it lubricates the passage of food and protects the epithelial cells in the nose and throat and lungs it can make it difficult for bacteria to penetrate the body through the epithelium.
<b>nectary</b>	A gland (often a protuberance or depression) that secretes nectar.
<b>perspiration</b>	Sweat. <i><b>Perspiration</b> ran down his forehead.</i>
<b>perspire</b>	Give out sweat through the pores of the skin as a result of heat, physical exertion, or stress. <i>Will was <b>perspiring</b> heavily.</i>
<b>phlegm</b>	Calmness of temperament. <i><b>Phlegm</b> and determination carried them through many difficult situations.</i>
<b>produce</b>	Cause to happen, occur or exist. <i>He <b>produced</b> a sheet of paper from his pocket.</i>
<b>retch</b>	Make an unsuccessful effort to vomit; strain to vomit. <i>With a sudden <b>retch</b> he vomited all over the floor.</i>
<b>saliva</b>	A clear liquid secreted into the mouth by the salivary glands and mucous glands of the mouth moistens the mouth and starts the digestion of starches.
<b>salivary</b>	Of or relating to saliva. <i>The <b>salivary</b> glands.</i>
<b>sebaceous</b>	Relating to a sebaceous gland or its secretion.
<b>secretion</b>	A substance discharged by secretion. <i>Hormonal <b>secretions</b>.</i>

- spew** Expel or eject (saliva or phlegm or sputum) from the mouth.  
*Buses were **spewing** out black clouds of exhaust.*
- spit** The act of spitting forcefully expelling saliva.  
*It began to **spit**.*
- sputum** Expectorated matter; saliva mixed with discharges from the respiratory passages; in ancient and medieval physiology it was believed to cause sluggishness.
- sweat** Exude sweat.  
*He was **sweating** profusely.*
- swell** Expand abnormally.  
*The low murmur **swelled** to a roar.*
- thymus** A lymphoid organ situated in the neck of vertebrates which produces T lymphocytes for the immune system The human thymus becomes much smaller at the approach of puberty.
- urinary** Of or relating to the urinary system of the body.  
*The **urinary** tract.*
