- (of a person's expression or manner) having an enigmatic or conspiratorial quality.
- (of a person or an organization) inclined to conceal feelings and intentions or not to disclose information.
- *Inclined to secrecy or reticence about divulging information.*
- (of a state or activity) characterized by the concealment of intentions and information.

introverted (of a community, company, or other group) concerned principally with

quiet Free of noise or uproar; or making little if any sound.

A **quiet** audience at the concert.

reserved Set aside for the use of a particular person or party.

A **reserved** seat.

reticent Not revealing one's thoughts or feelings readily.

She was extremely **reticent** about her personal affairs.

secret Of information given in confidence or in secret.

A **secret** alcoholic.



silent

self-contained Constituting a complete and independent unit in and of itself.

Saying or recording nothing on a particular subject.

A **silent** dog whistle.

tacitum (of a person) reserved or uncommunicative in speech; saying little.

After such gatherings she would be **taciturn** and morose.

tightlipped Inclined to secrecy or reticence about divulging information.

uncommunicative Not inclined to talk or give information or express opinions.


The **uncommunicative** Emily disappeared.

be delayed.
