- *A distinct part or branch of a nation's economy or society or of a sphere of activity such as education.*
- *The plane figure enclosed by two radii of a circle or ellipse and the arc between them.*
- *A plane figure bounded by two radii and the included arc of a circle.*
- *A subdivision of an area for military operations.*
- *Measuring instrument consisting of two graduated arms hinged at one end.*
- *A mathematical instrument consisting of two arms hinged at one end and marked with sines, tangents, etc. for making diagrams.*
- *A social group that forms part of the society or the economy.*
- *The minimum track length that can be assigned to store information; unless otherwise specified a sector of data consists of 512 bytes.*
- *A subdivision of a track on a magnetic disk.*
- *A portion of a military position.*
- *An area or portion that is distinct from others.*
- *A particular aspect of life or activity.*

| field | Fielders collectively or the manner in which they are spread over the pitch. <i>The variation in the strength of the field.</i> |
| layer | A shoot fastened down to take root while attached to the parent plant. <i>The majority of fish are egg layers.</i> |
| locality | A surrounding or nearby region. <i>The rock s size and locality.</i> |
| neighbourhood | The area surrounding a particular place, person, or object. <i>She lived in a wealthy neighbourhood of Boston.</i> |
| part | The part played by a person in bringing about a result. <i>Those of you who jet off to foreign parts for your holidays.</i> |
| precinct | The police station situated in a precinct. <i>At the precinct a desk sergeant ran through her ID.</i> |
| quarter | A square charge which covers the top left dexter chief quarter of the field. <i>It s a quarter til 4.</i> |
| section | A representation of the internal structure of something as if it has been cut through vertically or horizontally. <i>This last section of the questionnaire relates solely to training.</i> |
| side | A television channel considered as one of two or more that are available. <i>The house was built on the side of a mountain.</i> |
| sphere | The apparent surface of the imaginary sphere on which celestial bodies appear to be projected. <i>His social sphere is limited.</i> |
| stratum | An abstract place usually conceived as having depth. <i>A stratum of flint.</i> |
| subdivision | A self-contained part of a larger composition (written or musical). <i>The subdivision of existing subjects.</i> |
| zone | A belt or girdle worn round a person's body. <i>United are still in the relegation zone.</i> |

| <u>branch</u> | Of a tree or plant bear or send out branches. <i>Follow this track south until it branches into two.</i> |
| department | A specified aspect or quality. <i>Baking is not my department.</i> |
| fractional | Relating to or expressed as a fraction, especially a fraction less than one. <i>Fractional crystallization.</i> |
| fragmentary | Consisting of small disconnected or incomplete parts. <i>Fragmentary remains.</i> |
| <u>half</u> | A half price fare or ticket especially for a child. <i>The northern half of the island.</i> |
| <u>incomplete</u> | Not having all the necessary or appropriate parts. <i>Incomplete carvings of cattle.</i> |
| intersect | Divide (something) by passing or lying across it. <i>The area is intersected only by minor roads.</i> |
| least | Used in names of very small animals and plants e.g least shrew. <i>He had a knack for showing up when he was least expected.</i> |
| offshoot | A thing that develops from something else. <i>Commercial offshoots of universities.</i> |
| overtone | A musical tone which is a part of the harmonic series above a fundamental note, and may be heard with it. <i>Overtones of despair.</i> |
| part | The appropriate or expected behaviour in a particular role or situation one's duty. <i>Hold the furthest part of your leg that you can reach.</i> |
| <u>partial</u> | A harmonic with a frequency that is a multiple of the fundamental frequency. <i>Partial collapse.</i> |
| <u>partially</u> | To some extent; in some degree; not wholly. <i>The work partially fulfills the function of a historical memoir.</i> |
| partly | To some extent; not completely. <i>You re only partly right.</i> |

| portion | Money or property brought by a woman to her husband at marriage. <i>One end of the barn was portioned off for poultry.</i> |
| quarter | Cut a log into quarters and these into planks so as to show the grain well. <i>The riot squad gave no quarter.</i> |
| retraction | The act of pulling or holding or drawing a part back. <i>Prey are grasped between the jaws upon tongue retraction.</i> |
| secant | A straight line that intersects a curve at two or more points. |
| sectarian | Rigidly following the doctrines of a sect or other group. <i>A Jewish sectarian who preached the redemption of the Gentiles.</i> |
| section | Divide into sections. <i>This last section of the questionnaire relates solely to training.</i> |
| segment | Divide into segments. <i>The cells segmented.</i> |
| serration | A row of notches. <i>The pliers had serrations to improve the grip.</i> |
| sketchy | (of a picture) resembling a sketch; consisting of outline without much detail. <i>The information they had was sketchy.</i> |
| some | To some extent quite a lot. <i>That was some party.</i> |
| somewhat | To certain extent or degree. <i>Matters have improved somewhat since then.</i> |
| subdivision | The action of subdividing or being subdivided. <i>Such an arrangement offers the possibility of subdivision into a series of identical spaces.</i> |
| unfinished | Not brought to the desired final state. <i>The building is still unfinished.</i> |
| wreckage | The remaining parts of something that has been wrecked. <i>They searched the wreckage for signs of survivors.</i> |
