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Associations of "Security s" (30 Words)

avalanche	Undergo a rapid increase in conductivity due to an avalanche process. <i>The program brought an avalanche of mail.</i>
bodyguard	A group of men who escort and protect some important person.
burglar	A person who commits burglary.
chaperone	Accompany as a chaperone. <i>Chaperones sat at the edge of the dance gossiping and watching.</i>
convoy	(of a warship or armed troops) accompany (a group of ships or vehicles) for protection. <i>A convoy of lorries.</i>
counterespionage	Spying on the spies.
defend	State or assert. <i>We shall defend our island whatever the cost.</i>
defensible	Capable of being defended. <i>A morally defensible penal system.</i>
encryption	The process of converting information or data into a code, especially to prevent unauthorized access. <i>I use encryption to protect sensitive information transmitted online.</i>
espionage	The practice of spying or of using spies, typically by governments to obtain political and military information. <i>The camouflage and secrecy of espionage.</i>
fender	A low metal guard to confine falling coals to a hearth. <i>In Britain they call a fender a wing.</i>
firewall	Protect a network or system from unauthorized access with a firewall. <i>A firewalled network.</i>
guard	The person who plays the position of guard on a basketball team. <i>The gates were guarded by soldiers.</i>

infiltration	The process of gradually permeating or becoming a part of something. <i>The army fenced parts of the border in an effort to stop militant infiltration.</i>
landslide	A collapse of a mass of earth or rock from a mountain or cliff. <i>Businessmen have been buried under a landslide of paperwork.</i>
latch	Fasten with a latch. <i>Latch the door.</i>
patrol	Maintain the security of by carrying out a patrol. <i>A submarine patrol.</i>
police	Members of a police force. <i>There are fewer women police than men.</i>
probation	A trial period during which an offender has time to redeem himself or herself. <i>Probation is part of the sentencing process.</i>
protecting	Shielding (or designed to shield) against harm or discomfort. <i>A protecting alibi.</i>
safeguard	Make safe. <i>The charity called for tougher safeguards to protect Britain's remaining natural forests.</i>
safely	Without being injured or harmed. <i>You can safely assume I'm not going to resign.</i>
safety	The successful act of striking a baseball in such a way that the batter reaches base safely. <i>A safety helmet.</i>
sentry	A person employed to keep watch for some anticipated event. <i>On sentry duty.</i>
shelter	Provide shelter for. <i>An air raid shelter.</i>
tenable	Able to be maintained or defended against attack or objection. <i>A scholarship of 200 per annum tenable for three years.</i>
ward	The grooves in the bit of a key that correspond to the wards in a lock. <i>The ward and care of the Crown.</i>
watchman	A member of a body of people employed to keep watch in a town at night. <i>A night watchman.</i>
waterproof	A garment, especially a coat, that keeps out water. <i>She put on boots and a waterproof.</i>
