<b>languorous</b>	Characterized by tiredness or inactivity, especially of a pleasurable kind. <i>A hot <b>languorous</b> afternoon.</i>
<b><u>lazy</u></b>	(of a river) slow-moving. <i>He was too <b>lazy</b> to cook.</i>
<b>leisured</b>	Leisurely. <i>The <b>leisured</b> life of his college.</i>

<b>leisurely</b>	Not hurried or forced. <i>A <b>leisurely</b> breakfast at our hotel.</i>
<b>measured</b>	The rhythmic arrangement of syllables. <i>Walking at the same <b>measured</b> pace.</i>
<b>placid</b>	Not easily upset or excited. <i>Remained <b>placid</b> despite the repeated delays.</i>
<b>plodding</b>	Slow and laborious. <i><b>Plodding</b> methodical Ralph Bellamy.</i>
<b>relaxed</b>	Free from tension and anxiety. <i>The <b>relaxed</b> atmosphere of the hotel.</i>
<b>restful</b>	Affording physical or mental rest. <i>The rooms were cool and <b>restful</b>.</i>
<b>serene</b>	Completely clear and fine. <i><b>Serene</b> certainty.</i>
<b>slow</b>	Slow to learn or understand lacking intellectual acuity. <i>A <b>slow</b> and mostly aimless narrative.</i>
<b>slow and steady</b>	Indicating a time earlier than the correct time.
<b>slow-moving</b>	Moving slowly.
<b>sober</b>	Not affected by a chemical substance (especially alcohol). <i>His expression became <b>sober</b>.</i>
<b>solemn</b>	Not cheerful or smiling; serious. <i>He swore a <b>solemn</b> oath to keep faith.</i>
<b>staid</b>	Sedate, respectable, and unadventurous. <i><b>Staid</b> law firms.</i>
<b>steady</b>	Relating to a person who does something regularly. <i>A <b>steady</b> job.</i>
<b>tranquil</b>	Free from disturbance by heavy waves. <i>A lake of <b>tranquil</b> blue water reflecting a <b>tranquil</b> blue sky.</i>
<b>undemanding</b>	Requiring little if any patience or effort or skill. <i>Simple <b>undemanding</b> affection.</i>
<b>unflappable</b>	Having or showing calmness in a crisis. <i><b>Unflappable</b> in a crisis.</i>
<b>unhurried</b>	Relaxed and leisurely; without hurry or haste. <i>People strolling about in an <b>unhurried</b> way.</i>
<b>unruffled</b>	Free from emotional agitation or nervous tension- Anthony Trollope. <i>The <b>unruffled</b> waters of the lake.</i>

**unrushed**            Characterized by an absence of haste; unhurried.  
                              *The service is **unrushed** encouraging you to linger.*

**composed**         Having one's feelings and expression under control; calm.

**composure**         The state or feeling of being calm and in control of oneself.  
                              *He accepted their problems with **composure** and she with equanimity.*

**coolheaded**         Marked by calm self-control (especially in trying circumstances); unemotional.

**decorous**           According with custom or propriety.

**lull**                  Make calm or still.  
                              *There was a **lull** in the storm.*

**noiseless**           Silent or very quiet.  
                              *The 4000 1 and 4000 2 use an adaptive **noiseless** data algorithm to compress data in real time.*

**nonviolence**       Peaceful resistance to a government by fasting or refusing to cooperate.

**pacific**             The largest ocean in the world.  
                              *A **pacific** gesture.*

**placid**               (of a body of water) free from disturbance by heavy waves.  
                              *A ribbon of sand between the angry sea and the **placid** bay.*



<b>poise</b>	A cgs unit of dynamic viscosity equal to one dyne-second per square centimeter; the viscosity of a fluid in which a force of one dyne per square centimeter maintains a velocity of 1 centimeter per second. <i>The world was <b>poised</b> between peace and war.</i>
<b>quiet</b>	Become quiet or quieter. <i>Molly spoke with <b>quiet</b> confidence.</i>
<b>quietude</b>	A state of peace and quiet. <i>It highlights her <b>quietude</b> and wise passivity.</i>
<b>restful</b>	Affording physical or mental rest. <i>She spent a <b>restful</b> night at home.</i>
<b>sedation</b>	A state of calm or sleep produced by a sedative drug. <i>He was distraught with grief and under <b>sedation</b>.</i>
<b>seemly</b>	According with custom or propriety. <i>I felt it was not <b>seemly</b> to observe too closely.</i>
<b>serene</b>	An expanse of clear sky or calm sea. <i>He remained <b>serene</b> in the midst of turbulence.</i>
<b>solemn</b>	Formal and dignified. <i>The judge was <b>solemn</b> as he pronounced sentence.</i>
<b>staid</b>	Characterized by dignity and propriety. <i><b>Staid</b> law firms.</i>
<b>still</b>	Make or become still quieten. <i>We could <b>still</b> win.</i>
<b>tranquil</b>	Free from disturbance; calm. <i>A lake of <b>tranquil</b> blue water reflecting a <b>tranquil</b> blue sky.</i>
<b>tranquility</b>	A disposition free from stress or emotion.
<b>tranquilize</b>	Make calm or still.
<b>tranquilizer</b>	A drug used to reduce stress or tension without reducing mental clarity.
<b>tranquillity</b>	The quality or state of being tranquil; calm. <i>Passing cars are the only noise that disturbs the <b>tranquillity</b> of rural life.</i>
<b>undaunted</b>	Not intimidated or discouraged by difficulty, danger, or disappointment. <i>They were <b>undaunted</b> by the huge amount of work needed.</i>
<b>unflappable</b>	Having or showing calmness in a crisis. <i><b>Unflappable</b> in a crisis.</i>
