amorous	Expressive of or exciting sexual love or romance. <i>Amorous glances.</i>
appealing	(of characters in literature or drama) evoking empathic or sympathetic feelings. <i>An appealing look.</i>
attractive	Having the properties of a magnet; the ability to draw or pull. <i>Foliage can be as attractive as flowers.</i>
<u>beguiling</u>	Misleading by means of pleasant or alluring methods. <i>The voice was low and beguiling.</i>
bewitching	Capturing interest as if by a spell. <i>A bewitching debut album.</i>

captivating	Capturing interest as if by a spell. <i>Roosevelt was a captivating speaker.</i>
coquettish	Like a coquette. <i>A coquettish grin.</i>
engaging	Attracting or delighting. <i>An engaging frankness.</i>
enticing	Attractive or tempting; alluring. <i>Difficult to say no to an enticing advertisement.</i>
fascinating	Extremely interesting. <i>A fascinating woman.</i>
flirtatious	Expressing a playful sexual attraction. <i>She was beautiful and very flirtatious.</i>
immodest	Lacking humility or decency. <i>Brash immodest boasting.</i>
inviting	Offering the promise of an attractive or enjoyable experience. <i>An inviting offer.</i>
irresistible	Too powerful or convincing to be resisted. <i>What happens when an irresistible force meets an immovable object.</i>
passionate	Having or expressing strong emotions. <i>Passionate pleas for help.</i>
provocative	Intended or intending to arouse sexual desire or interest. <i>A provocative sidelong glance.</i>
raunchy	Suggestive of or tending to moral looseness. <i>The restaurant's style is raunchy and the sanitation chancy.</i>
ravishing	Delightful; entrancing. <i>She looked ravishing.</i>
sensuous	Relating to or affecting the senses rather than the intellect. <i>Her voice was rather deep but very sensuous.</i>
sexually exciting	Creating or arousing excitement.
shameless	(of a person or their conduct) characterized by or showing a lack of shame; barefaced or brazen. <i>A shameless imposter.</i>
slinky	(of a garment) fitting closely to the lines of the body. <i>A slinky black evening dress.</i>
steamy	Filled with steam or emitting moisture in the form of vapor or mist. <i>Steamy towels.</i>

Indicative or evocative.

A **suggestive** remark.

sultry

Sexually exciting or gratifying.

The **sultry** late summer weather had brought swarms of insects.

tantalizing

Very pleasantly inviting.

A **tantalizing** aroma.

tempting

Highly attractive and able to arouse hope or desire.

A **tempting** repast.

winning

Attractive; endearing.

A **winning** personality.

allure	The power to entice or attract through personal charm. <i>Will sponsors really be allured by such opportunities.</i>
alluring	Highly attractive and able to arouse hope or desire. <i>An alluring prospect.</i>
appealing	Attractive or interesting. <i>He added an appealing and memorable figure to popular American mythology.</i>
attract	Be attractive to. <i>I was attracted to the idea of working for a ballet company.</i>
attraction	The force by which one object attracts another. <i>The timeless attraction of a good tune.</i>
attractive	Having the properties of a magnet; the ability to draw or pull. <i>The attractive force between the magnets and the metal plate.</i>
<u>captivate</u>	Attract and hold the interest and attention of; charm. <i>He was captivated by her beauty.</i>
<u>charm</u>	A characteristic property of certain subatomic particles specifically charm quarks charm antiquarks and hadrons containing these expressed as a quantum number. <i>She will charm your warts away.</i>
<u>charming</u>	Very pleasant or attractive. <i>A charming country cottage.</i>
<u>chic</u>	Stylishness and elegance, typically of a specified kind. <i>The hotel s lobby and restaurant are the height of designer chic.</i>
<u>coquettish</u>	Behaving in such a way as to suggest a playful sexual attraction; flirtatious. <i>A coquettish grin.</i>
<u>desirable</u>	A desirable person or thing. <i>The store sells various desirables.</i>
engaging	Charming and attractive. <i>An engaging smile.</i>
<u>entice</u>	Attract or tempt by offering pleasure or advantage. <i>The treat is offered to entice the dog to eat.</i>
enticing	Highly attractive and able to arouse hope or desire. <i>An enticing prospect.</i>

<u>entrance</u>	A movement into or inward. <i>An entrance examination.</i>
<u>fascinate</u>	Attract the strong attention and interest of (someone). <i>The snake charmer fascinates the cobra.</i>
fashion	The production and marketing of new styles of clothing and cosmetics. <i>The bottles were fashioned from green glass.</i>
glamorize	Interpret romantically. <i>This new wallpaper really glamorizes the living room.</i>
glamorous	Having an air of allure, romance and excitement. <i>Being a singer must be such a glamorous lifestyle.</i>
<u>inviting</u>	Offering the promise of an attractive or enjoyable experience. <i>An inviting offer.</i>
<u>lure</u>	Something used to lure fish or other animals into danger so they can be trapped or killed. <i>The child was lured into a car but managed to escape.</i>
<u>personable</u>	(of a person) having a pleasant appearance and manner. <i>She is quite a personable young woman.</i>
raffish	Unconventional and slightly disreputable, especially in an attractive way. <i>A cocktail party given by some raffish bachelors.</i>
<u>seduction</u>	An act of winning the love or sexual favor of someone. <i>She was planning a seduction.</i>
<u>tempt</u>	Dispose or incline or entice to. <i>Jobs which involve entertaining may tempt you to drink more than you intend.</i>
<u>tempting</u>	Very pleasantly inviting. <i>A tempting financial offer.</i>
winsome	Attractive or appealing in a fresh, innocent way. <i>A winsome smile.</i>
