Associations of "Seek out" (30 Words)

aboveground	On or above the surface of the ground. <i>Aboveground nuclear testing.</i>
absentee	A person who is expected or required to be present at a place or event but is not. <i>Absentee pupils.</i>
absenteeism	Habitual absence from work. <i>High levels of absenteeism caused by low job motivation.</i>
away	An away match or win. <i>When he was ten or twelve feet away he stopped.</i>
by	In reserve; not for immediate use. <i>Put something by for her old age.</i>
cave	Explore caves as a sport. <i>He caved because his position had become untenable.</i>
chase	Make further investigation of an unresolved matter. <i>The dog chased after the stick.</i>
exclude	Prevent from entering; keep out. <i>The cost for the trip excludes food and beverages.</i>
exhale	Give out (breath or an odor). <i>The jungle exhaled mists of early morning.</i>
explore	Examine (organs) for diagnostic purposes. <i>He sets out to explore fundamental questions.</i>
exterior	The outer structure of a building. <i>An ideal spot to film exteriors.</i>
find	Get or find back recover the use of. <i>I find him to be obnoxious.</i>
forage	Food such as grass or hay for horses and cattle; fodder. <i>The birds forage for aquatic invertebrates insects and seeds.</i>

<u>gawk</u>	An awkward or shy person. <i>Let those country gawks dance to their hearts content.</i>
goggle	(of the eyes) open wide or protrude. <i>Their goggle mesmerizes even fishmongers.</i>
grotto	A small cave (usually with attractive features). <i>Visits to Father Christmas s grotto.</i>
home	Made done or intended for use in the home. <i>Canadian tariffs enabled United States lumber companies to raise prices at home.</i>
hound	Used in names of dogfishes e g nurse hound smooth hound. <i>A hound came running through the trees nose to the ground.</i>
hunt	Use a hound or a horse for hunting. <i>Lionesses hunt in groups.</i>
look	Look forward to the probable occurrence of. <i>My backyard look onto the pond.</i>
poach	Cook by simmering in a small amount of liquid. <i>A breakfast of poached egg and grilled bacon.</i>
<u>quest</u>	The act of searching for something. <i>The quest for a reliable vaccine has intensified.</i>
<u>rummage</u>	Find (something) by rummaging. <i>Open up the box and have a rummage around.</i>
scavenger	A person who searches for and collects discarded items. <i>A reputation as a scavenger of discarded odds and ends.</i>
<u>scour</u>	Remove dirt or unwanted matter by scouring. <i>Scour the counter tops.</i>
search	Search or seek. <i>They are searching for the missing man in the entire county.</i>
shooting	The action or practice of shooting with a gun. <i>His shooting was slow but accurate.</i>
sidelong	Inclining or directed to one side - Bram Stoker. <i>Darting eyes looking sidelong out of a wizened face.</i>
sideways	From the side; obliquely. <i>Leaning sideways.</i>
<u>vault</u>	The act of jumping over an obstacle. <i>The masterpieces were deposited in the vaults of Swiss banks.</i>
