<a href="#">emerge</a>	Come out of. <i>Suddenly the proprietor <b>emerged</b> from his office.</i>
<a href="#">emerging</a>	Becoming apparent or prominent. <i>Established and <b>emerging</b> artists.</i>
<a href="#">likely</a>	Likely but not certain to be or become true or real. <i>Speculation on the <b>likely</b> effect of opting out.</i>
<a href="#">look</a>	Look forward to the probable occurrence of. <i>The child <b>looks</b> unhappy.</i>
<a href="#">loom</a>	Weave on a loom. <i>Another air plane <b>loomed</b> into the sky.</i>
<a href="#">odds</a>	The chances or likelihood of something happening or being the case. <i>It is possible for the race to be won at very long <b>odds</b>.</i>

<b>plausible</b>	(of a person) skilled at producing persuasive arguments, especially ones intended to deceive. <i>It seems <b>plausible</b> that one of two things may happen.</i>
<b>possible</b>	The highest possible score especially in a shooting competition. <i>I d like the report this afternoon if <b>possible</b>.</i>
<b>potential</b>	Latent qualities or abilities that may be developed and lead to future success or usefulness. <i>A campaign to woo <b>potential</b> customers.</i>
<b>potentiality</b>	An aptitude that may be developed. <i>The technology is still relatively not well known in spite of its great <b>potentiality</b>.</i>
<b>predominate</b>	Be larger in number, quantity, power, status or importance. <i>The huge sculpture <b>predominates</b> over the fountain.</i>
<b>presumable</b>	Capable of being inferred on slight grounds.
<b>presumptive</b>	Having a reasonable basis for belief or acceptance. <i>The <b>presumptive</b> heir or heir apparent.</i>
<b>probable</b>	Likely but not certain to be or become true or real. <i>It is <b>probable</b> that the economic situation will deteriorate further.</i>
<b>probably</b>	Almost certainly; as far as one knows or can tell. <i>She would <b>probably</b> never see him again.</i>
<b>promising</b>	Showing possibility of achievement or excellence. <i>A <b>promising</b> start to the season.</i>
<b>prone</b>	Likely or liable to suffer from, do, or experience something unpleasant or regrettable. <i>I was lying <b>prone</b> on a foam mattress.</i>
<b>prospective</b>	Of or concerned with or related to the future. <i>A meeting to discuss <b>prospective</b> changes in government legislation.</i>
<b>provident</b>	Careful in regard to your own interests. <i>She had learned to be <b>provident</b>.</i>
<b>scenario</b>	A postulated sequence or development of events. <i>A possible <b>scenario</b> is that he was attacked after opening the front door.</i>
<b>supposed</b>	Required or under orders. <i>The <b>supposed</b> existence of ghosts.</i>
<b>tend</b>	Have a tendency or disposition to do or be something be inclined. <i>Walter <b>tended</b> towards corpulence.</i>
