odds	The chances or likelihood of something happening or being the case. <i>It is possible for the race to be won at very long odds.</i>

plausible	(of a person) skilled at producing persuasive arguments, especially ones intended to deceive. <i>It seems plausible that one of two things may happen.</i>
possible	The highest possible score especially in a shooting competition. <i>I d like the report this afternoon if possible.</i>
potential	Latent qualities or abilities that may be developed and lead to future success or usefulness. <i>A campaign to woo potential customers.</i>
potentiality	An aptitude that may be developed. <i>The technology is still relatively not well known in spite of its great potentiality.</i>
predominate	Be larger in number, quantity, power, status or importance. <i>The huge sculpture predominates over the fountain.</i>
presumable	Capable of being inferred on slight grounds.
presumptive	Having a reasonable basis for belief or acceptance. <i>The presumptive heir or heir apparent.</i>
probable	Likely but not certain to be or become true or real. <i>It is probable that the economic situation will deteriorate further.</i>
probably	Almost certainly; as far as one knows or can tell. <i>She would probably never see him again.</i>
promising	Showing possibility of achievement or excellence. <i>A promising start to the season.</i>
prone	Likely or liable to suffer from, do, or experience something unpleasant or regrettable. <i>I was lying prone on a foam mattress.</i>
prospective	Of or concerned with or related to the future. <i>A meeting to discuss prospective changes in government legislation.</i>
provident	Careful in regard to your own interests. <i>She had learned to be provident.</i>
scenario	A postulated sequence or development of events. <i>A possible scenario is that he was attacked after opening the front door.</i>
supposed	Required or under orders. <i>The supposed existence of ghosts.</i>
tend	Have a tendency or disposition to do or be something be inclined. <i>Walter tended towards corpulence.</i>
