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

Seeming as an Adjective

Definitions of "Seeming" as an adjective

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “seeming” as an adjective can have the following definitions:

- *Appearing as such but not necessarily so.*
- *Appearing to be real or true, but not necessarily being so; apparent.*
- *Giving the impression of having a specified quality.*



Synonyms of "Seeming" as an adjective (14 Words)

<u>alleged</u>	Declared but not proved. <i>Alleged abuses of housing benefits.</i>
<u>apparent</u>	Seeming real or true, but not necessarily so. <i>For all his apparent wealth he had no money to pay the rent.</i>
<u>avowed</u>	Openly declared as such. <i>They came to power with the avowed aim of promoting religious toleration.</i>
declared	Declared as fact explicitly stated. <i>They are both declared atheists.</i>
feigned	Simulated or pretended; insincere. <i>Feigned sympathy.</i>
<u>ostensible</u>	Appearing as such but not necessarily so. <i>The real dispute which lay behind the ostensible complaint.</i>
outward	Relating to the external appearance of something rather than its true nature. <i>An outward journey.</i>
pretended	Adopted in order to deceive. <i>A pretended interest.</i>
professed	Professing to be qualified. <i>A professed and conforming Anglican.</i>
<u>purported</u>	Appearing or stated to be true, though not necessarily so; alleged. <i>The purported marriage was void.</i>
so-called	Doubtful or suspect.
specious	Misleading in appearance, especially misleadingly attractive. <i>A specious argument.</i>
<u>supposed</u>	Doubtful or suspect. <i>The supposed existence of ghosts.</i>
<u>surface</u>	Denoting ships which travel on the surface of the water as distinct from submarines. <i>Surface layers.</i>



Usage Examples of "Seeming" as an adjective

- *Ellen's seeming indifference to the woman's fate.*
- *An angry-seeming man.*
- *His seeming honesty.*



Associations of "Seeming" (30 Words)

- apparent** Seeming real or true, but not necessarily so.
*His **apparent** lack of concern.*
- apparently** Unmistakably ('plain' is often used informally for 'plainly').
*She has **apparently** been living here for some time.*
- casing** The housing or outer covering of something.
*A waterproof **casing**.*
- cuticle** The outer layer of the skin covering the exterior body surface of vertebrates.
*The body is covered with a non living **cuticle** of chitin.*
- dabbler** An amateur who engages in an activity without serious intentions and who pretends to have knowledge.
- epidermis** The outer layer of tissue in a plant, except where it is replaced by periderm.
- evident** Clearly revealed to the mind or the senses or judgment.
*A clearly **evident** erasure in the manuscript.*

<u>exterior</u>	Situated in or suitable for the outdoors or outside of a building. <i>Exterior grade plywood.</i>
<u>external</u>	(of hardware) not contained in the main computer; peripheral. <i>For external application only.</i>
externalize	Make external or objective, or give reality to. <i>Such neuroses are externalized as interpersonal conflicts.</i>
<u>extrinsic</u>	Not forming an essential part of a thing or arising or originating from the outside. <i>Extrinsic evidence.</i>
<u>facing</u>	A piece of material sewn on the inside of a garment, especially at the neck and armholes, to strengthen it. <i>The regiment's uniforms had orange facings.</i>
<u>guise</u>	An external form, appearance, or manner of presentation, typically concealing the true nature of something. <i>He visited in the guise of an inspector.</i>
integument	An outer protective covering such as the skin of an animal or a cuticle or seed coat or rind or shell. <i>This chemical compound is found in the integument of the seed.</i>
<u>ostensible</u>	Represented or appearing as such; pretended. <i>His ostensible purpose was charity his real goal popularity.</i>
outer	A shot that strikes the outer. <i>Spent hours adorning the outer man.</i>
outrigger	A boat fitted with an outrigger.
<u>outside</u>	Coming from the outside. <i>An outside margin.</i>
outward	Outwards. <i>An outward display of friendliness.</i>
<u>outwardly</u>	In outward appearance. <i>Outwardly featureless modern offices.</i>
peripheral	A peripheral device. <i>She will see their problems as peripheral to her own.</i>
putative	Purported; commonly put forth or accepted as true on inconclusive grounds. <i>The putative author of the book.</i>
rind	The tough outer skin of certain fruit, especially citrus fruit. <i>Olive oil infused with lemon rinds.</i>
sapwood	The soft outer layers of recently formed wood between the heartwood and the bark, containing the functioning vascular tissue.

- seemingly** From appearances alone.
*It s touch and go **seemingly** and she s asking for you.*
- semblance** Resemblance similarity.
*He hoped his claims would have a **semblance** of authenticity.*
- smatter** Speak with spotty or superficial knowledge.
*She **smatters** Russian.*
- superficial** Denoting a quantity of a material expressed in terms of area covered rather than linear dimension or volume.
***Superficial** knowledge.*
- surface** Provide something especially a road with a particular surface.
*Roll out the dough on a floured **surface**.*
