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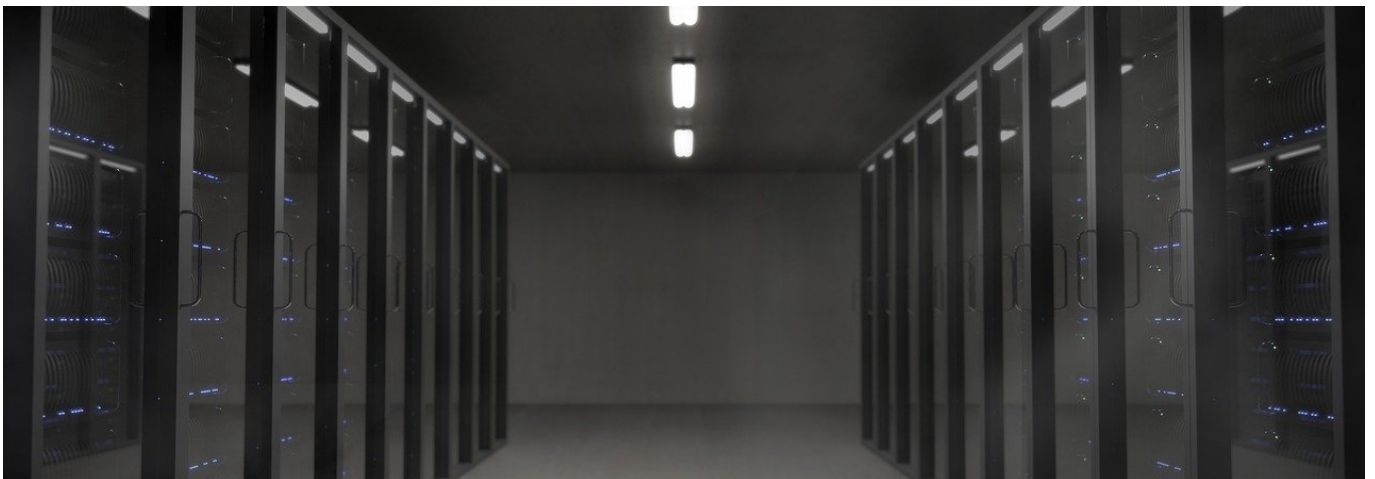

## Seeming as an Adjective

### Definitions of "Seeming" as an adjective

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “seeming” as an adjective can have the following definitions:

- *Appearing as such but not necessarily so.*
- *Appearing to be real or true, but not necessarily being so; apparent.*
- *Giving the impression of having a specified quality.*



## Synonyms of "Seeming" as an adjective (14 Words)

- alleged** Declared but not proved.  
*Alleged abuses of housing benefits.*
- apparent** Seeming real or true, but not necessarily so.  
*For all his **apparent** wealth he had no money to pay the rent.*
- avowed** Openly declared as such.  
*They came to power with the **avowed** aim of promoting religious toleration.*
- declared** Declared as fact explicitly stated.  
*They are both **declared** atheists.*
- feigned** Simulated or pretended; insincere.  
***Feigned** sympathy.*
- ostensible** Appearing as such but not necessarily so.  
*The real dispute which lay behind the **ostensible** complaint.*
- outward** Relating to the external appearance of something rather than its true nature.  
*An **outward** journey.*
- pretended** Adopted in order to deceive.  
*A **pretended** interest.*
- professed** Professing to be qualified.  
*A **professed** and conforming Anglican.*
- purported** Appearing or stated to be true, though not necessarily so; alleged.  
*The **purported** marriage was void.*
- so-called** Doubtful or suspect.
- specious** Misleading in appearance, especially misleadingly attractive.  
*A **specious** argument.*
- supposed** Doubtful or suspect.  
*The **supposed** existence of ghosts.*
- surface** Denoting ships which travel on the surface of the water as distinct from submarines.  
***Surface** layers.*



## Usage Examples of "Seeming" as an adjective

- *Ellen's seeming indifference to the woman's fate.*
- *An angry-seeming man.*
- *His seeming honesty.*





## Associations of "Seeming" (30 Words)

- apparent** Seeming real or true, but not necessarily so.  
*His **apparent** lack of concern.*
- apparently** Unmistakably ('plain' is often used informally for 'plainly').  
*She has **apparently** been living here for some time.*
- casing** The housing or outer covering of something.  
*A waterproof **casing**.*
- cuticle** The outer layer of the skin covering the exterior body surface of vertebrates.  
*The body is covered with a non living **cuticle** of chitin.*
- dabbler** An amateur who engages in an activity without serious intentions and who pretends to have knowledge.
- epidermis** The outer layer of tissue in a plant, except where it is replaced by periderm.
- evident** Clearly revealed to the mind or the senses or judgment.  
*A clearly **evident** erasure in the manuscript.*

<b>exterior</b>	Situated in or suitable for the outdoors or outside of a building. <i><b>Exterior</b> grade plywood.</i>
<b>external</b>	(of hardware) not contained in the main computer; peripheral. <i>For <b>external</b> application only.</i>
<b>externalize</b>	Make external or objective, or give reality to. <i>Such neuroses are <b>externalized</b> as interpersonal conflicts.</i>
<b>extrinsic</b>	Not forming an essential part of a thing or arising or originating from the outside. <i><b>Extrinsic</b> evidence.</i>
<b>facing</b>	A piece of material sewn on the inside of a garment, especially at the neck and armholes, to strengthen it. <i>The regiment's uniforms had orange <b>facings</b>.</i>
<b>guise</b>	An external form, appearance, or manner of presentation, typically concealing the true nature of something. <i>He visited in the <b>guise</b> of an inspector.</i>
<b>integument</b>	An outer protective covering such as the skin of an animal or a cuticle or seed coat or rind or shell. <i>This chemical compound is found in the <b>integument</b> of the seed.</i>
<b>ostensible</b>	Represented or appearing as such; pretended. <i>His <b>ostensible</b> purpose was charity his real goal popularity.</i>
<b>outer</b>	A shot that strikes the outer. <i>Spent hours adorning the <b>outer</b> man.</i>
<b>outrigger</b>	A boat fitted with an outrigger.
<b>outside</b>	Coming from the outside. <i>An <b>outside</b> margin.</i>
<b>outward</b>	Outwards. <i>An <b>outward</b> display of friendliness.</i>
<b>outwardly</b>	In outward appearance. <i><b>Outwardly</b> featureless modern offices.</i>
<b>peripheral</b>	A peripheral device. <i>She will see their problems as <b>peripheral</b> to her own.</i>
<b>putative</b>	Purported; commonly put forth or accepted as true on inconclusive grounds. <i>The <b>putative</b> author of the book.</i>
<b>rind</b>	The tough outer skin of certain fruit, especially citrus fruit. <i>Olive oil infused with lemon <b>rinds</b>.</i>
<b>sapwood</b>	The soft outer layers of recently formed wood between the heartwood and the bark, containing the functioning vascular tissue.



**seemingly** From appearances alone.  
*It s touch and go **seemingly** and she s asking for you.*

**semblance** Resemblance similarity.  
*He hoped his claims would have a **semblance** of authenticity.*

**smatter** Speak with spotty or superficial knowledge.  
*She **smatters** Russian.*

**superficial** Denoting a quantity of a material expressed in terms of area covered rather than linear dimension or volume.  
***Superficial** knowledge.*

**surface** Provide something especially a road with a particular surface.  
*Roll out the dough on a floured **surface**.*
