Pesticides and fertilizers that **leach** into rivers.

leak Be leaked.

Slowly exude or discharge a viscous fluid.

She **ooze**s a raunchy sex appeal.

percolate Permeate or penetrate gradually.

It will have to be instant coffee there s no time to **percolate** any.

Spread throughout (something); pervade.

Water **permeate**s sand easily.

Fill soak or imbue totally.

sweat Get rid of something from the body by exuding sweat.
