- cut** Used of grass or vegetation cut down with a hand implement or machine.  
***Cut** a ticket.*



<b>emit</b>	Produce and discharge (something, especially gas or radiation). <i>The ozone layer blocks some harmful rays which the sun <b>emits</b>.</i>
<b>filter</b>	Remove by passing through a filter. <i>An oil <b>filter</b>.</i>
<b>hole</b>	Hit the ball into a hole. <i>She is missed terribly and her death has left a <b>hole</b> in all our lives.</i>
<b>imbue</b>	Fill soak or imbue totally. <i>His works are invariably <b>imbued</b> with a sense of calm and serenity.</i>
<b>impregnate</b>	Fertilize and cause to grow. <i>Wood which had been <b>impregnated</b> with preservative.</i>
<b>infiltrate</b>	An infiltrating substance or a number of infiltrating cells. <i>The student organization was <b>infiltrated</b> by a traitor.</i>
<b>leach</b>	Cause a liquid to leach or percolate. <i>Pesticides and fertilizers that <b>leach</b> into rivers.</i>
<b>leaky</b>	Used informally; unable to retain urine. <i>A <b>leaky</b> roof.</i>
<b>omnipresent</b>	Widely or constantly encountered; widespread. <i>The <b>omnipresent</b> threat of natural disasters.</i>
<b>ooze</b>	Give a powerful impression of (a quality). <i>Honey <b>oozed</b> out of the comb.</i>
<b>penetrable</b>	Possible to understand; understandable. <i>The outer membrane is <b>penetrable</b>.</i>
<b>percolate</b>	Gain or regain energy. <i>It will have to be instant coffee there s no time to <b>percolate</b> any.</i>
<b>perforate</b>	Perforated. <i><b>Perforate</b> the sheets of paper.</i>
<b>permeable</b>	(of a material or membrane) allowing liquids or gases to pass through it. <i>A frog s skin is <b>permeable</b> to water.</i>
<b>permeate</b>	Pass through. <i>The aroma of soup <b>permeated</b> the air.</i>
<b>pervade</b>	Spread or diffuse through. <i>A smell of stale cabbage <b>pervaded</b> the air.</i>
<b>pervious</b>	Admitting of passage or entrance. <i><b>Pervious</b> rocks.</i>
<b>pierce</b>	Move or affect (a person's emotions or bodily feelings) deeply or sharply. <i>The cold <b>pierced</b> her bones.</i>

- piercing** (of a sound) extremely high or loud.  
*She let out a **piercing** scream.*
- porous** Able to absorb fluids.  
*The partly **porous** walls of our digestive system.*
- pushing** The act of applying force in order to move something away.  
*The **pushing** is good exercise.*
- sap** A piece of metal covered by leather with a flexible handle; used for hitting people.  
*Her illness had **sapped** her of energy and life.*
- snap** Take a snapshot of.  
*He can hear the **snap** of a twig.*
- stick** Stick to firmly.  
*A **stick** of dynamite.*
