

<u>emit</u>	Produce and discharge (something, especially gas or radiation. The ozone layer blocks some harmful rays which the sun emit s.
filter	Remove by passing through a filter. An oil filter .
hole	Hit the ball into a hole. She is missed terribly and her death has left a hole in all our lives.
imbue	Fill soak or imbue totally. His works are invariably imbue d with a sense of calm and serenity.
impregnate	Fertilize and cause to grow. Wood which had been impregnate d with preservative.
<u>infiltrate</u>	An infiltrating substance or a number of infiltrating cells. <i>The student organization was infiltrated by a traitor</i> .
leach	Cause a liquid to leach or percolate. Pesticides and fertilizers that leach into rivers.
leaky	Used informally; unable to retain urine. A leaky roof.
<u>omnipresent</u>	Widely or constantly encountered; widespread. The omnipresent threat of natural disasters.
<u>002e</u>	Give a powerful impression of (a quality. Honey ooze d out of the comb.
penetrable	Possible to understand; understandable. <i>The outer membrane is penetrable</i> .
percolate	Gain or regain energy. It will have to be instant coffee there s no time to percolate any.
perforate	Perforated. <i>Perforate</i> the sheets of paper.
permeable	(of a material or membrane) allowing liquids or gases to pass through it. <i>A frog s skin is permeable to water.</i>
<u>permeate</u>	Pass through. The aroma of soup permeate d the air.
<u>pervade</u>	Spread or diffuse through. A smell of stale cabbage pervade d the air.
pervious	Admitting of passage or entrance. <i>Pervious</i> rocks.
<u>pierce</u>	Move or affect (a person's emotions or bodily feelings) deeply or sharply. The cold $\ensuremath{\textit{pierce}}\xspace$ her bones.



piercing	(of a sound) extremely high or loud. She let out a piercing scream.
porous	Able to absorb fluids. The partly porous walls of our digestive system.
pushing	The act of applying force in order to move something away. The pushing is good exercise.
sap	A piece of metal covered by leather with a flexible handle; used for hitting people. Her illness had sap ped her of energy and life.
snap	Take a snapshot of. He can hear the snap of a twig.
stick	Stick to firmly. A stick of dynamite.
