**hardly ever** Almost not.

infrequently

Not often; rarely.

A storage area for infrequently used items.

**not often** Many times at short intervals.

once in a while On one occasion.only now and then And nothing more.



**only occasionally** Never except when.

Not often; seldom.

<u>rarely</u> The **rarely** fine Sheraton bookcase.

Only a very short time before. scarcely

They could **scarcely** all be wrong.

scarcely ever Only a very short time before.

Occasionally or at irregular intervals. sporadically

He worked **sporadically** at part time jobs.

### Usage Examples of "Seldom" as an adverb

• Islay is seldom visited by tourists.

• An old seldom-used church.

• He was seldom absent.

Only just; almost not. **barely**

They had such fun over the wonderful box of **curio**s that Jack had sent curio

from India.

The rate at which something occurs over a particular period of time or in a

**frequency** given sample.

An increase in the **frequency** of accidents due to increased overtime.

Many times at short intervals. **frequently** 

They go abroad **frequently**. Slowly and with difficulty.

Not occurring often; rare. infrequent

Occurring or appearing at usually irregular intervals. occasional

**Occasional** freelancer seeks full time position.

At infrequent or irregular intervals; now and then. occasionally

*Very occasionally* the condition can result in death.

Something unusual — perhaps worthy of collecting. oddity

Realizing the **oddity** of the remark he retracted it.

Frequently or in great quantities. often

He **often** goes for long walks by himself.

Frequently; many times. oftentimes

Sensory processing is **oftentimes** a challenge for someone with ASD.

(of an event, situation, or condition) not occurring very often.

**Rare** patches of green in the desert.

Not often: seldom. rarely

Noteworthy scarcity. rareness

Work hastily or carelessly; deal with inadequately and superficially. scant

Small or insufficient in quantity or amount. scanty

Only a very short time before.

Occasionally, rather than all of the time. sometimes

**Sometimes** I want to do things on my own.

Not dense.

**sparse** Information on earnings is **sparse**.

In a thinly dispersed manner; in small numbers.

sparsely A **sparsely** furnished apartment.

Occurring at irregular intervals or only in a few places; scattered or

isolated. **sporadic** 

A city subjected to **sporadic** bombing raids.

Occasionally or at irregular intervals. sporadically

He only works **sporadically**.

**uncommonly** Exceptionally.

Not usual or common or ordinary.
