only occasionally Never except when.

Only a very short time before. scarcely

scarcely ever Only a very short time before.

Occasionally or at irregular intervals. sporadically

He worked **sporadically** at part time jobs.

Only just; almost not. **barely**

occasional Occurring or appearing at usually irregular intervals.

Occasional freelancer seeks full time position.

occasionally At infrequent or irregular intervals; now and then.

Very **occasionally** the condition can result in death.

oddity Something unusual — perhaps worthy of collecting.

Realizing the **oddity** of the remark he retracted it.

often Frequently or in great quantities.

He **often** goes for long walks by himself.

oftentimes Frequently; many times.

Sensory processing is **oftentimes** a challenge for someone with ASD.

(of an event, situation, or condition) not occurring very often.

Rare patches of green in the desert.

rarely Not often; seldom.

The **rarely** fine Sheraton bookcase.

rareness Noteworthy scarcity.

rarity Noteworthy scarcity.

scant Work hastily or carelessly; deal with inadequately and superficially.

Companies with **scant** regard for the safety of future generations.
